### **WEEK IN REVIEW**

- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 30 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 11 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 48 ANIMALS. THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER CURRENTLY HAS 275 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE. ON JUNE 24, ANIMAL WELFARE PARTNERED WITH THE NORMAN TWILIGHT MARKET FOR AN OFFSITE ADOPTION EVENT WHERE FIVE ANIMALS FOUND THEIR FOREVER HOMES.
- NPD RECEIVED A REPORT OF A BURGLARY IN PROGRESS AT A RESIDENCE IN THE 4400 BLK OF LAS COLINAS LANE ON JUNE 21. FOUR INDIVIDUALS FORCED ENTRY INTO THE HOME. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED ONE OF THE SUSPECTS RUNNING FROM THE RESIDENCE WITH A FIREARM TAKEN FROM INSIDE THE HOME. THE SUSPECT WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AFTER A SHORT FOOT PURSUIT AND WAS BOOKED INTO THE CLEVELAND COUNTY DETENTION CENTER ON MULTIPLE COMPLAINTS. OFFICERS SEARCHED THE RESIDENCE AND SURROUNDING AREA FOR APPROXIMATELY THREE HOURS, BUT WERE UNABLE TO LOCATE ANY OF THE OTHER SUSPECTS. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED A MISSING PERSONS REPORT FOR A 20-YEAR-OLD WOMAN AND HER 6-WEEK-OLD CHILD WHO WERE BELIEVED TO BE IN DANGER. AFTER THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION, AN ASHANTI ALERT WAS ISSUED. BOTH SUBJECTS WERE SAFELY LOCATED.
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN ARMED ROBBERY IN THE 400 BLK OF 24TH AVE NW ON JUNE 23. THE VICTIM WAS APPROACHED BY AN UNKNOWN INDIVIDUAL AND ASKED TO PROVIDE HIS WALLET AS WELL AS PROPERTY FROM INSIDE THE BUSINESS. THE CASE REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A CARJACKING IN THE AREA OF 24TH NW AND MAIN ST ON JUNE 24. OFFICERS LOCATED THE VEHICLE NEARBY WITH THE SUSPECT INSIDE. THE JUVENILE SUSPECT WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT INCIDENT AND TAKEN TO THE COUCH DETENTION CENTER FOR LARCENY OF A VEHICLE. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION REVEALED THE 15-YEAR-OLD TOOK THE VEHICLE AFTER IT WAS LEFT UNLOCKED AND RUNNING AT A CONVENIENCE STORE
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF CHILD IN A VEHICLE THAT WAS TURNED OFF WITH THE WINDOWS UP AND DOORS LOCKED ON JUNE 24. NORMAN FIRE BROKE THE WINDOW AND REMOVED THE CHILD WHO WAS FOUND TO NOT BE IN DISTRESS OR INJURED. DHS RESPONDED AS PART OF A JOINT RESPONSE AND TO COMPLETE FOLLOW-UP ON THE INCIDENT
