WEEK IN REVIEW

- NPD HOSTED ITS ANNUAL NATIONAL NIGHT OUT NORMAN EVENT AT SOONER MALL ON 10/2 TO PROMOTE POLICE AND COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS. NUMEROUS LOCAL AND STATE PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCIES PARTICIPATED ALONG WITH LOCAL BUSINESSES AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS. THE EVENT BROUGHT HUNDREDS OF COMMUNITY MEMBERS TOGETHER.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A ROBBERY AT A BUSINESS IN THE 3600 BLK OF W TECUMSEH RD ON 10/3. THE VICTIM WAS WALKING TO THE BUSINESS WHEN TWO VEHICLES PULLED UP TO HIM. A SUSPECT PULLED OUT A GUN AND TOOK THE VICTIM'S PHONE AND BAG. NO INJURIES WERE REPORTED. NO SUSPECTS HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED. INVESTIGATION IS ONGOING.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN ATTEPMTED ROBBERY NEAR CLASSEN BLVD AND 24TH AVE SE ON 10/6. THE REPORTING PARTY WAS DRIVING AND STOPPED BY A PERSON STANDING IN THE ROADWAY SHINING A FLASHLIGHT IN THE THEIR FACE. THE MOTORIST WAS ABLE TO SAFELY GET DRIVE AWAY. OFFICERS CONTACTED A SUBJECT NEARBY WHO MATCHED THE DESCRIPTION OF THE PERSON IN THE ROADWAY. DURING THE CONTACT, OFFICERS LOCATED A FLASHLIGHT, DRUGS, DRUG PARAPHERNALIA, AND VARIOUS STOLEN ITEMS. THE SUBJECT WAS ARRESTED ON THESE OFFENSES AND BOOKED INTO CCDC.
- · AN OFFICER ATTEMPTED TO STOP A VEHICLE FOR RECKLESS DRIVING NEAR 12TH AVE NE AND ROBINSON ST ON 10/7. THE DRIVER DID NOT STOP AND CONTINUED TO DRIVE AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED WITH TOTAL DISREGARD FOR THE PUBLIC. DESPITE NUMEROUS ATTEMPTS TO STOP THE VEHICLE, OFFICERS LOST SIGHT OF THE VEHICLE AS IT APPROACHED THE EAST EDGE OF NORMAN'S JURISDICTION. THE VEHICLE INFORMATION WAS PROVIDED TO NEIGHBORING LAW ENFORCEMENT FOR AWARENESS. OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO IDENTIFY THE DRIVER AND REQUESTED A WARRANT FOR THE DRIVER'S ARREST.
