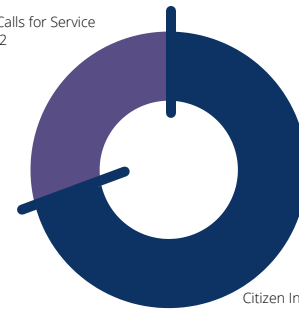

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION INVOLVING A VEHICLE AND PEDESTRIAN AT THE INTERSECTION OF MAIN AND ED NOBLE PARKWAY ON 12/7. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED A PEDESTRIAN WITH A HEAD INJURY AND THE INVOLVED VEHICLE NEARBY. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT THE PEDESTRIAN WAS INITIALLY DRIVING ANOTHER VEHICLE. THE PEDESTRIAN HAD BECOME UPSET WITH THE DRIVER OF THE OTHER VEHICLE AND CONFRONTED THEM AT THE RED LIGHT LEADING TO A PHYSICAL DISTURBANCE AND THREATS TO SHOOT THE DRIVER. AT THIS TIME, THE DRIVER DROVE OFF CAUSING INJURIES TO THE PEDESTRIAN. THE PEDESTRIAN WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE OUPD/NPD CIPT TEAM AND THE CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION.
- PATROL RESPONDED TO A REPORTED ROBBERY AT A RESIDENCE IN THE 400 BLK OF SE 12TH AVENUE ON 12/9. THE VICTIM SAID THAT THEY WERE APPROACHED BY TWO UNKNOWN INDIVIDUALS WHO POINTED A GUN AT THEM AND TOOK A PHONE, KEYS, WALLET, AND HEADPHONES FROM THEIR BACKPACK BEFORE LEAVING THE AREA ON FOOT. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A STABBING IN THE 100 BLOCK OF REED AVENUE ON 12/9. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED ONE ADULT MALE ON HIS FRONT PORCH WITH A STAB WOUND TO HIS NECK. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT TWO ADULT MALES WERE ENGAGED IN A VERBAL DISTURBANCE BEFORE THE STABBING OCCURRED. THE OTHER INDIVIDUAL -- UNKNOWN TO THE VICTIM -- RAN AWAY FROM THE SCENE BEFORE OFFICERS ARRIVED. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION.
