

#### **WEEK IN REVIEW**

- NPD PROVIDED HOLIDAY ASSISTANCE TO MORE THAN 300 CHILDREN AND MORE THAN 60
   FAMILIES THROUGHOUT THE HOLIDAY SEASON. THE DEPARTMENT'S ANNUAL FILL THE
   CRUISER EVENT ALSO COLLECTED 2,000 DIAPERS AND SEVEN CASES OF WIPES FOR THE
   CENTER FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES BABY PANTRY.
- THE HAZARDOUS DEVICES UNIT WAS CALLED TO A VEHICLE PARKED NEAR A BUSINESS IN THE 2400 BLK OF W. MAIN ST. ON 12/24. THE VEHICLE WAS UNOCCUPIED, BUT A NOTE WAS ATTACHED SAYING THERE WAS A BOMB INSIDE. BOMB TECHNICIANS SAFELY SEARCHED THE VEHICLE AND WERE ABLE TO ENSURE IT WAS CLEAR OF HAZARDS WITHOUT INCIDENT.
- AN OFFICER CONDUCTED A TRAFFIC STOP ON A VEHICLE ON 12/25 FOR A TRAFFIC VIOLATION. THE DRIVER EXPLAINED THAT THEIR 3-YEAR-OLD CHILD NEEDED TO GET TO THE EMERGENCY ROOM. THE OFFICER FOLLOWED THE DRIVER TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL WHERE THE CHILD TESTED POSITIVE FOR THC. DHS WAS CONTACTED. INITIAL INFORMATION INDICATES THE CHILD CONSUMED UNSECURED THC PRODUCTS IN THE HOME.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SINGLE VEHICLE COLLISION AT 132ND AVE SE AND HWY 9 ON 12/28. INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THE VEHICLE WAS TRAVELING EAST WHEN IT DEPARTED THE ROADWAY AND HIT SEVERAL TREES. THE OCCUPANT HAD TO BE EXTRACATED BY NORMAN FIRE AND EMSSTAT. THE OCCUPANT WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE CIRT TEAM.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE 300 BLK OF 36TH AVE SW ON 12/28 FOR A REPORTED CARJACKING. INITIAL INFORMATION INDICATES THE VICTIM WAS MAKING A GROCERY DELIVERY. WHEN SHE RETURNED TO HER VEHICLE, SHE WAS CONFRONTED BY A SUBJECT WHO POINTED A HANDGUN AT HER DEMANDING THE VEHICLE. THE SUSPECT TOOK THE VEHICLE AND LEFT THE AREA. THE VEHICLE WAS LOCATED UNOCCUPIED IN OKLAHOMA CITY LATER THAT EVENING, AND AN INDIVIDUAL MATCHING THE SUSPECT DESCRIPTION WAS ARRESTED NEARBY BY OCPD.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 23 ANIMALS ADOPTED, ONE ANIMAL TRANSFERRED OUT TO RESCUE, AND FOUR ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 39 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 147 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 44 OF THOSE ANIMALS IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
