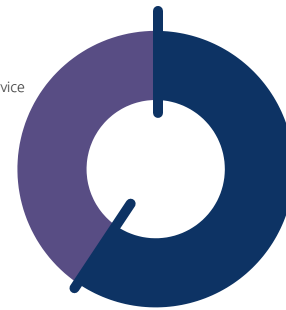

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SHOOTING IN THE 200 BLOCK OF BULL RUN ON 1/1. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS WERE UNABLE TO LOCATE A VICTIM. COMMUNICATIONS THEN RECEIVED A CALL FROM THE RESIDENT IN THE 1600 BLK OF SUNRISE WHO WAS IN CONTACT WITH A SUBJECT WHO HAD BEEN SHOT TWO TIMES IN THE LEG. OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THAT LOCATION AND ADMINISTERED LIFE-SAVING MEASURES AHEAD OF FIRE AND EMSSTAT ARRIVING. THE VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A DISTURBANCE WITH WEAPONS IN THE 2100 BLK OF MERIDIAN DR ON 1/6. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT A 16-YEAR-OLD WAS ENGAGED IN AN ARGUMENT OVER THE PHONE WITH AN ACQUAINTANCE. A FAMILY MEMBER OF THE 16-YEAR-OLD TOOK THE PHONE AND TOLD THE OTHER PARTY THEY SHOULD COME OVER TO FIGHT. THE OTHER PARTY CAME TO THE RESIDENCE AND KICKED THE DOOR IN AN ATTEMPT TO GAIN ENTRY. THE FAMILY MEMBER GRABBED HIS GUN AND FIRED INTO THE GROUND TO SCARE THE OTHER PARTY AWAY. THE OTHER PARTY THEN GOT BACK INTO A VEHICLE AND LEFT THE AREA. OFFICERS LOCATED ALL INVOLVED PARTIES, AND IT WAS DETERMINED THAT NO ONE HAD BEEN SHOT OR INJURED. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 31 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 13 ANIMALS TRANSFERRED OUT TO RESCUES, AND 10 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 50 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 146 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 41 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
