WEEK IN REVIEW

- ANIMAL WELFARE OFFICERS RESPONDED ON 4/15 TO 7 DUCKLINGS WHO HAD FALLEN INTO A STORM DRAIN NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF 49TH AVE NW AND TECUMSEH RD. THE INTERSECTION WAS BLOCKED BY VEHCILES REQUIRING ASSISTANCE FROM PATROL FOR TRAFFIC CONTROL. ALL THE DUCKLINGS WERE RESCUED THROUGH THE HEROIC EFFORTS OF CITIZENS, ANIMAL WELFARE OFFICERS, AND VOLUNTEERS ALIKE.
- ON 4/19 ANIMAL WELFARE PARTNERED WITH "DOG IS MY COPILOT" AND TRANSFERRED 38 ANIMALS FROM OUR FACILITY TO RESCUE ORGANIZATIONS IN COLORADO AND OREGON. THIS WAS THE FIRST OF 4 SCHEDULED RESCUE FLIGHTS THIS YEAR.
- COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED A REPORT OF A ROBBERY IN THE 100 BLK OF ED NOBLE PKWY ON 4/19. A SUBJECT ENTERED A BUSINESS, ASKED FOR A PEN AND A NAPKIN, AND WROTE A NOTE DEMANDING MONEY AND THREATENING TO HURT EMPLOYEES. THE SUBJECT WALKED AWAY WITHOUT MONEY. AN OFFICER LATER CONTACTED THE SUBJECT IN A VEHICLE NEARBY AND FOUND THE NOTE. THE SUBJECT WAS ARRESTED WITHOUT INCIDENT.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 18 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 40 OTHER ANIMALS TRANSFERRED TO RESCUES, AND 6 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 69 ANIMALS, AND THEY CURRENTLY HAVE 140 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 35 OF THOSE ARE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
