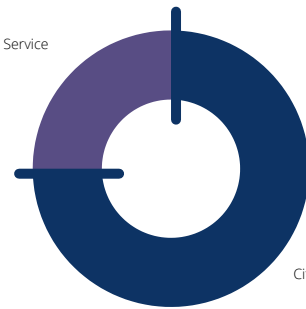

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- NPd HOSTED A SUCCESSFUL COMMUNITY SAFETY DAY ON APRIL 24 WITH OVER 200 ATTENDEES. THE EVENT RESULTED IN 11,500 POUNDS OF DOCUMENTS SHREDDED, 100 POUNDS OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS COLLECTED FOR PROPER DISPOSAL, AND MORE THAN 80 GUN LOCKS DISTRIBUTED.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SINGLE VEHICLE COLLISION WITH SERIOUS INJURY IN THE 2700 BLOCK OF E. LINDSEY ST. ON APRIL 28 AT APPROXIMATELY 6PM. THE SINGLE VEHICLE COLLISION INVOLVED A MOTORCYCLE. THE DRIVER OF THE MOTORCYCLE WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL WITH A HEAD INJURY. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION. .
- OFFICERS ARREST ONE FOLLOWING A REPORT OF A BURGLARY IN THE 900 BLOCK OF 12TH AVE AT 1:26AM ON APRIL 29. UPON ARRIVAL ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED A MALE EXITING THE BUSINESS WITH PROPERTY FROM INSIDE THE STORE. THE MALE WAS ARRESTED AND BOOKED IN ON ONE COUNT OF BURGLARY - SECOND DEGREE.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SINGLE VEHICLE COLLISION WITH INJURY JUST EAST OF S. DAM RD. AND STATE HIGHWAY 9 ON APRIL 29 AT 2:49PM. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION REVEALED A VEHICLE TRAVELING EASTBOUND DEPARTED THE ROADWAY FOR AN UNKNOWN REASON, LOST CONTROL, AND THEN OVERCORRECTED. THE VEHICLE ROLLED AND THE DRIVER WAS EJECTED. THE DRIVER WAS FOUND DECEASED AT THE SCENE. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
