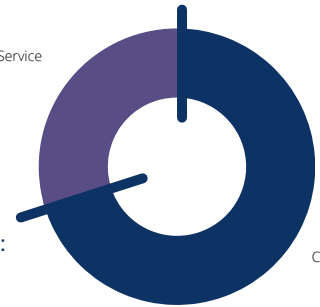

WEEK IN REVIEW

- PATROL RESPONDED TO A REPORTED DISTURBANCE IN THE 3700 BLOCK OF TECUMSEH ROAD. OFFICERS WERE NOTIFIED THAT TWO SUSPECTS DISGUISED THEMSELVES AS SECURITY OFFICERS AND GAINED ENTRY INTO A RESIDENCE. THE VICTIM SHOT AT THE SUSPECTS. ONE SUSPECT WAS DISCOVERED AT A LOCAL HOSPITAL RECEIVING TREATMENT FOR A GUNSHOT WOUND. DETECTIVES INTERVIEWED THE SUSPECT. AS A RESULT, THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED ON CHARGES AND BOOKED INTO JAIL.
- POLICE RESPONDED TO THE SOONER MALL FOR A VANDALISM REPORT. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THEY SAW THREE PEOPLE IDENTIFIED AS THE SUSPECTS RUN FROM THE AREA. THE SUSPECTS WERE APPREHENDED A SHORT TIME LATER. THEY ALSO ADMITTED TO BURGLARIZING THE MALL A DAY EARLIER.
