### **WEEK IN REVIEW**

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A BOMB THREAT AT A BUSINESS IN THE 3600 BLK OF W. ROBINSON ST. A SUSPECT HAD TOLD EMPLOYEES THAT HE LEFT A PIPE BOMB IN THE BUSINESS. NO DEVICE WAS FOUND DURING A CHECK OF THE BUSINESS AND NORMAL BUSINESS WAS RESUMED.
- COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED A CALL FOR AN ATTEMPTED ROBBERY AT IN THE 2600 BLK OF W. ROBINSON. THE VICTIM WAS STAYING IN AN RV BEHIND THE STORE AND WAS APPROACHED BY SOMEONE CARRYING A MACHETE WHO ASKED FOR HIS WALLET. THE VICTIM STATED HE PUSHED THE INDIVIDUAL AND HE LEFT. PATROL SEARCHED THE AREA AND WAS UNABLE TO FIND THE SUSPECT.
- · OFFICERS WERE DISPATCHED TO A POSSIBLE ROBBERY IN THE AREA OF DUFFY AND SANTA FE. THE VICTIM WAS WALKING ALONE WHEN THEY WERE ASSAULTED BY TWO OTHER SUBJECTS WHO BEAT HER AND TRIED TO TAKE HER PURSE. THE VICTIM FELL UNCONSCIOUS FOR SEVERAL MINUTES. WHEN SHE WOKE UP SHE STILL HAD HER PURSE BUT AN INJURY TO HER RIBCAGE.
- DISPATCH RECEIVED A BURGLARY CALL IN THE 10800 BLK OF MYSTIC ISLE RD. A SUSPECT ENTERED AN OCCUPIED RESIDENCE. THE RESIDENTS LEFT THEIR HOME AND CALLED THE POLICE. AT THE SAME TIME A NEIGHBOR REPORTED SEEING A MAN WITH AN AR-15 WALKING DOWN THE STREET. OFFICERS QUICKLY DETERMINED THAT THE SUSPECT IN BOTH CALLS WAS A NEARBY RESIDENT. OFFICERS WORKED WITH BOTH CALLERS AND THE SUSPECT'S PARENTS TO MAKE CONTACT WITH THE SUBJECT IN A SAFE MANNER. ALTHOUGH THE SUSPECT BRIEFLY TRIED TO FLEE, HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT.
- · ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 41 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 7 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. ADDITIONALLY THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 55 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 205 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 85 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
