WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF VEHICLE STOLEN FROM A BUSINESS PARKING LOT IN THE 800 BLOCK OF ED NOBLE PARKWAY ON 2/4. OFFICERS SEARCHING THE AREA LOCATED THE VEHICLE NEARBY AND ATTEMPTED TO MAKE A TRAFFIC STOP. THE SUSPECT DID NOT STOP AND CONTINUED TO DRIVE WITHOUT REGARD FOR THE SAFETY OF OTHERS. ALL ATTEMPTS TO STOP THE VEHICLE UTILIZING A TACTICAL VEHICLE INTERVENTION WERE ALSO UNSUCCESSFUL. THE SUSPECT CONTINUED TO DRIVE RECKLESSLY AND CRASHED THE VEHICLE BEFORE EXITING AND CONTINUING TO RUN FROM THE AREA. OFFICERS TOOK THE SUSPECT INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT INCIDENT FOLLOWING A SHORT FOOT PURSUIT. HE WAS ARRESTED FOR VARIOUS CHARGES RELATED TO THE VEHICLE THEFT, RECKLESS DRIVING, ALONG WITH A FELONY WARRANT.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN AUTO BURGLARY IN THE 2400 BLOCK OF WESTPORT DRIVE ON 2/8. THE VICTIMS CONFRONTED THE SUSPECT AFTER SEEING THEM BURGLARIZING THEIR VEHICLE RESULTING IN A PHYSICAL ALTERCATION. ANOTHER SUSPECT WAS THEN REPORTED TO POINT A GUN AT VICTIMS. THE SUSPECTS THEN LEFT THE AREA. THIS INCIDENT REMAINS AN ACTIVE INVESTIGATION.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 47 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 12 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER, AND 2 ANIMALS TRANSFERRED OUT TO RESCUES THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 61 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 103 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 24 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
