#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- FOUR NPD OFFICERS WERE RECENTLY RECOGNIZED FOR THEIR WORK ON TRAFFIC SAFETY AT THE 31ST ANNUAL OKLAHOMA BUCKLEDOWN AWARDS. OFFICERS HERRERA, BURK, DAWSON, AND GRAVES RECEIVED AWARDS FOR THEIR EFFORTS IN TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT AND COLLISION PREVENTION.
- POLICE RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A BURGLARY AT A GUN STORE IN THE 1000 BLOCK OF N. FLOOD AVE THAT OCCURRED ON 3/30. FIVE FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION WERE STOLEN FROM THE BUSINESS. AFTER REVIEWING CAMERA FOOTAGE, OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO IDENTIFY, LOCATE, AND ARREST THE SUSPECT. ALL FIVE FIREARMS AND A MAJORITY OF THE AMMUNITION WAS RECOVERED AND RETURNED TO THE BUSINESS.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION IN THE 1600 BLOCK OF ALAMEDA ST. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATED A CAR HAD DRIVEN INTO AN APARTMENT. THE DRIVER AND SOLE OCCUPANT OF THE VEHICLE WAS DETERMINED TO BE UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF AN INTOXICANT. UPON FURTHER INVESTIGATION, IT WAS DETERMINED THE DRIVER HAD A WARRANT OUT OF LOUISIANA FOR SECOND DEGREE MURDER. A LOADED FIREARM WAS ALSO LOCATED IN THE VEHICLE. THE OCCUPANTS OF THE APARTMENT WERE UNINJURED DURING THE INCIDENT. THE DRIVER WAS ARRESTED ON THE WARRANT AND OTHER CHARGES.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 29 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 9 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER, AND 1 ANIMAL TRANSFERRED OUT TO RESCUE THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 66 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 136 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 23 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
