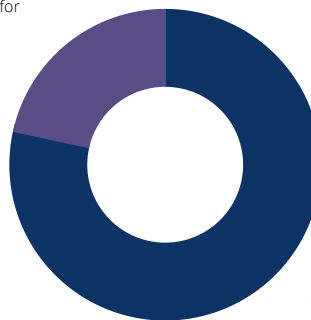

WEEK IN REVIEW

- PATROL OFFICERS ARREST ONE IN CONNECTION TO FIRST DEGREE BURGLARY INCIDENT IN THE 200 BLOCK OF E. HADDOCK ST. ON JAN. 14 JUST AFTER 12 A.M., AN INDIVIDUAL ATTEMPTED TO FORCE ENTRY INTO A RESIDENCE OCCUPIED BY A MOTHER AND HER TWO CHILDREN. OFFICERS OBSERVED FORCED ENTRY AT THE FRONT DOOR. OFFICERS LOCATED AND ARRESTED THE SUSPECT ABOUT 45 MINUTES LATER.
- WHILE PATROLLING IN THE AREA, OFFICERS FOUND AN INDIVIDUAL BREAKING INTO A CAR IN THE 1000 BLOCK OF GARVER ST. AT 5:45AM ON JAN. 14. THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED.
- PATROL OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A RESIDENTIAL ALARM ACTIVATION IN THE 3900 BLOCK OF E. TECUMSEH RD. ON JAN. 15 AT 2:16PM. UPON ARRIVAL, OFFICERS SAW TWO POSSIBLE SUSPECTS RUN INTO A NEARBY WOODED AREA. OFFICERS ESTABLISHED A DYNAMIC AND REACTIVE PERIMETER COORDINATING A GROUND SEARCH THAT RESULTED IN THE SUSPECTS BEING LOCATED AND ARRESTED.
- LT. BRYANT JOINED THE VIRTUE CENTER ON THEIR PODCAST, HOPE AHEAD, TO TALK ABOUT NPD'S CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT) AND THE ROLE OF NPD IN ASSISTING THOSE IN MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS IN THE NORMAN COMMUNITY.
