WEEK IN REVIEW

- PACE ASSISTED PATROL ON A RESPONSE TO A DISTURBANCE AT A LOCAL HOTEL. DURING THE ARREST OF ONE INVOLVED INDIVIDUAL, MULTIPLE GUN BOXES WERE DISCOVERED. SIS ASSISTED ON A SEARCH WARRANT FOR THE HOTEL ROOM AND LOCATED TWO FIREARMS, TRAFFICKING AMOUNTS OF FENTENYL PILLS, AS WELL AS METHAMPHETAMINE AND COCAINE.
- PACE CONTACTED SUBJECTS IN A VEHICLE THAT WAS PREVIOUSLY SEEN IN THE SECURITY FOOTAGE OF A TRAILER THEFT. THE DRIVER WAS ARRESTED AFTER ADMITTING TO STEALING THE TRAILER. OFFICERS ALSO ASSISTED IN THE RECOVERY OF THE TRAILER.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A SUSPICIOUS PACKAGE CALL ON E BOYD ST. AN ON-SCENE EVALUATION BY THE HAZARDOUS DEVICES UNIT (HDU) DETERMINED THAT THE ITEMS WERE NOT HAZARDOUS.
- AS PART OF ONGOING WORK TO IDENTIFY A PORCH PIRATE CAUGHT ON VIDEO, OFFICERS OBSERVED THE SUSPECT VEHICLE LEAVING ANOTHER RESIDENCE. OFFICERS STOPPED THE VEHICLE AND ARRESTED THE DRIVER FOR MULTIPLE CLEVELAND COUNTY WARRANTS. DURING A LATER INTERVIEW, THE SUSPECT ADMITTED TO STEALING THE PACKAGE FROM THE VIDEO AND TOLD OFFICERS WHERE THE PROPERTY WAS PAWNED.
- NPD RECEIVED A REPORT OF A ROBBERY AT SYMMES ST. AND UNIVERSITY BLVD. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THE THREE VICTIMS STATED TWO SUSPECTS ARMED WITH A FIREARM APPROACHED THEM AND DEMANDED CASH. THE VICTIMS DID NOT HAVE ANY MONEY, SO THE SUSPECTS TOOK THE VICTIMS' CELL PHONES AND RAN FROM THE SCENE. OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO LOCATE AND RECOVER BOTH PHONES NEARBY.
