### **WEEK IN REVIEW**

- NPD DETECTIVES. IN COOPERATION WITH THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE, SECURED THE CONVICTIONS OF TWO SUBJECTS WHO WERE SENTENCED TO A COMBINED 68 YEARS OF PRISON TIME. CHARGES FOR BOTH INCLUDED 19 TOTAL COUNTS OF CHILD ABUSE, CHILD NEGLECT, AND ENABLING CHILD ABUSE.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A CAMPUS CORNER BUSINESS ON 11/27 AFTER A SUBJECT WALKED IN AND ASKED EMPLOYEES TO CALL POLICE REGARDING A ROBBERY THAT HAD OCCURRED SEVERAL HOURS EARLIER AT THEIR RESIDENCE. THE VICTIM REPORTED THAT TWO UNKNOWN PEOPLE ENTERED THE RESIDENCE, ASSAULTED THE VICTIM. AND TOOK PROPERTY. THE INCIDENT IS UNDER INVESTIGATION
- PATROL RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION IN THE 400 BLK OF S. PICKARD ON 11/29. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT THE VICTIM HAD BEEN INVOLVED IN A DISTURBANCE WITH THE OCCUPANTS OF THE VEHICLE AT A NEARBY RESIDENCE. AS THE SUSPECT WAS LEAVING THE RESIDENCE, HE STRUCK THE VICTIM AND THEN FLED THE SCENE. THE VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE NPD/OUPD CIRT TEAM.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SINGLE VEHICLE INJURY COLLISION IN THE 3200 BLOCK OF W ROBINSON ON 12/1. UPON ARRIVAL, OFFICERS CONTACTED THE SOLE OCCUPANT OF THE VEHICLE WHO WAS COMPLAINING OF INJURY. THE OCCUPANT WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL WHERE IT WAS DETERMINED THE INDIVIDUAL WAS IN CRITICAL CONDITION. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE NPD/OUPD CIRT TEAM.
- · ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 41 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND ONE ANIMAL RECLAIMED BY ITS OWNER, ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 43 ANIMALS AT THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 190 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 46 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS
