

WEEK IN REVIEW

- DETECTIVES ARE CURRENTLY INVESTIGATING AN OVERDOSE INCIDENT INVOLVING A 13-MONTH-OLD CHILD WHO HAD INGESTED FENTANYL. OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE HOSPITAL WHERE THE CHILD WAS THE ICU. THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE OVERDOSE REMAIN UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- · PATROL RESPONDED TO AN ALARM AT A BUSINESS IN THE 1400 BLOCK OF 24 AVE NW 12/15. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THEY ATTEMPTED TO CONTACT THREE JUVENILES WHO IMMEDIATELY RAN FROM THE AREA. TWO WERE QUICKLY APPREHENDED AND ONE WENT INTO ANOTHER BUSINESS WHERE THEY WERE LOCATED IN THE RESTROOM. ALL THREE (AND A FOURTH WHO HAD LEFT THE AREA PRIOR TO OFFICERS' ARRIVAL) WERE LATER IDENTIFIED AS RUNAWAYS FROM A LOCAL JUVENILE FACILITY.
- THE DEPARTMENT CELEBRATED THE GRADUATION OF OUR 64TH NORMAN POLICE ACADEMY. THESE NINE PROBATIONARY POLICE OFFICERS ARE NOW IN FIELD TRAINING. ALSO, OUR 65TH ACADEMY GRADUATED FROM THE BASIC POLICE OFFICER COURSE AT THE MOORE/NORMAN TECHNOLOGY CENTER. THESE TWO CADETS ARE NOW ATTENDING AN NPD SPECIFIC MINI-ACADEMY BEFORE THEY WILL TRANSITION TO FIELD TRAINING.
- · OFFICERS, ALONG WITH NFD AND EMSSTAT, RESPONDED TO THIRD-PARTY INFORMATION OF AN UNKNOWN MEDICAL EMERGENCY AT A BUSINESS IN THE 2300 BLOCK OF W. MAIN STREET ON 12/11. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED A SINGLE SUBJECT WHO WAS NOT BREATHING IN THE BACK OF THE BUSINESS. SOON AFTER MEDICAL PERSONNEL DETERMINED THAT THE SUBJECT WAS ALREADY DECEASED. WHILE THERE WERE NO OBVIOUS SIGNS OF FOUL PLAY, THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- · ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 46 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 7 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK A TOTAL OF 60 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 176 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 38 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
