

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE 3000 BLK OF PHEASANT RUN RD ON 1/16 FOR A REPORT OF A SUBJECT APPROACHING CARS, HITTING WINDOWS, AND INSTIGATING FIGHTS. AFTER CONTACTING WITNESSES, OFFICERS FOUND THE SUBJECT BEHIND A NEARBY BUSINESS. THE SUBJECT APPROACHED THE OFFICERS AGGRESSIVELY AND REFUSED TO LISTEN TO INSTRUCTIONS. THE SUBJECT CONTINUED HIS AGGRESSIVE APPROACH, WAS TASED, AND THEN PLACED INTO CUSTODY FOR PUBLIC INTOXICATION WITH NO FURTHER INCIDENT OR INJURY.
- · OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A DRIVER WHO HAD LOST CONTROL OF THEIR MOTORCYCLE ON A PATCH OF ICE NEAR ROBINSON ST AND THE RAILROAD UNDERPASS ON 1/17. INITIAL INFORMATION INDICATED THERE WERE NO OTHER VEHICLES OR SUBJECTS INVOLVED. THE DRIVER WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL FOR INJURIES SUSTAINED. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY CIRT.
- PATROL RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION NEAR HIGHWAY 9 AND 36TH AVE SE ON 1/18. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION DETERMINED A DRIVER HAD STOPPED ON THE SIDE OF THE ROAD AND HAD A INDIVIDUAL ASSISTING THEM WITH FIXING A FLAT TIRE ON THE VEHICLE WHEN ANOTHER VEHICLE HIT THE INDIVIDUAL. THE INDIVIDUAL WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL. THE INVESTIGATION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY CIRT.
