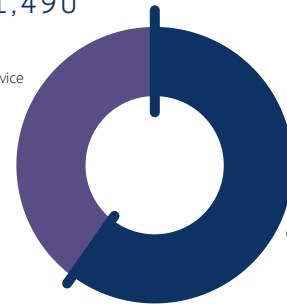

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A DOMESTIC ASSAULT IN PROGRESS INSIDE A RESIDENCE IN THE 3000 BLK OF PHEASANT RUN ON 4/6. AS OFFICERS ARRIVED ON SCENE, THEY COULD HEAR CLEAR SIGNS OF A DISTURBANCE INSIDE. DUE TO NO RESPONSE UPON ATTEMPTED CONTACT, OFFICERS FORCED ENTRY AND ASSISTED WITH GETTING BOTH THE ADULT VICTIM AND JUVENILE CHILD OUT OF THE RESIDENCE AND TO A SAFE LOCATION. THE SUSPECT THEN BARRICADED HIMSELF IN A BACK ROOM. AFTER NEGOTIATIONS, THE SUSPECT SURRENDERED AND WAS ARRESTED WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT FOR KIDNAPPING, DOMESTIC ASSAULT AND BATTERY BY STRANGULATION, AND DOMESTIC ABUSE IN THE PRESENCE OF A MINOR.
- NPD KICKED OFF RECORDS MANAGEMENT AND VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION MONTH ON 4/1. THANK YOU TO THE DEDICATED INDIVIDUALS WHO SERVE IN THESE ROLES. YOUR SERVICE IS ESSENTIAL TO OUR CONTINUED SUCCESS AND SERVICE TO THE NORMAN COMMUNITY.
- NPD HOSTED THE MONTHLY METRO CHIEFS MEETING AT THE WELL ON 4/4. HEADS OF LOCAL AGENCIES MET TO DISCUSS CRUCIAL TOPICS IMPACTING OUR COMMUNITIES, SHARE INSIGHTS ON EFFECTIVE POLICING, AND COLLABORATE.
- DURING THE WEEK, ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 36 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 11 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER, AND 2 ANIMALS TRANSFERRED OUT TO RESCUES. THEY TOOK IN 59 ANIMALS AND CURRENTLY HAVE 145 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE. 42 OF THOSE ANIMALS ARE CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTER FAMILIES.
