PRESS RELEASE

The Norman Fire Department responded to two residential structure fires on 12/21/2011. The first at 12:00 A.M. located at 3401 Allspice Run.

Upon arrival firefighters found a fire in the kitchen. Fire crews were able to extinguish the fire quickly with damage contained to the stove area and the nearby cabinets. The fire appears to have been a cooking fire according to the on-duty crew chief. There were no injuries reported by the occupants or the firefighters. Fourteen firefighters responded to the call with a preliminary damage estimate of \$2,000.

Firefighters were also called at 1:51 A.M. to the scene of a second residential structure fire located at 2120 Oakside Dr.

Upon arrival firefighters found heavy smoke and fire in the living room of the residence and confirmed all seven occupants were accounted for outside. Fire crews were able to extinguish the fire quickly with fire damage contained to the living room area. One male occupant in his early twenties sustained third degree burns to his left hand and second degree burns to his left ankle. The patient was transported by friends to Norman Regional hospital for evaluation and treatment. There were no further injuries reported at the scene.

Fifteen firefighters, EMSSTAT paramedics and Norman police were on scene. Preliminary damage estimates are \$25,000 to the structure and \$3,000 to the

contents. The cause of the fire is currently under investigation by the Norman Fire Marshal's Office.
