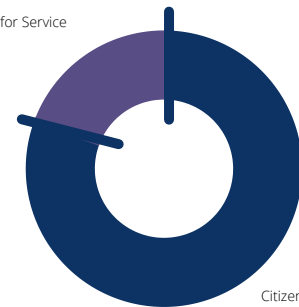

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO SEVERAL APARTMENT COMPLEX FIRES ALONG OAK TREE RD ON MAY 1. ALL FIRES OCCURRED WITHIN A SHORT PERIOD OF TIME. UPON ARRIVAL, OFFICERS DETAINED A MALE SUBJECT IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THE MOST RECENT FIRE. FIRE MARSHALS WERE NOTIFIED AND RESPONDED TO THE SCENE. THE MALE WAS ARRESTED FOR WARRANTS, PUBLIC INTOXICATION, POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA, AND POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA.
- NPD RESPONDED TO AN INJURY COLLISION INVOLVING A VEHICLE AND BICYCLE IN THE 3000 N. FLOOD AVE AT 11:11PM ON MAY 1. ONE INDIVIDUAL WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL. THE COLLISION IS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY CIRT.
- OFFICERS WITH OUR SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS SECTION, DISTRICT 21 TASKFORCE, PACE, AND PATROL ARREST ONE IN CONNECTION TO 6 CLEVELAND COUNTY WARRANTS AND 2 MUNICIPAL WARRANTS RELATING TO FELONY ELUDING, USE OF A STOLEN VEHICLE, POSSESSION OF STOLEN PROPERTY AND DRUGS, AND FRAUD.
- OFFICERS ARREST ONE FOLLOWING A STANDOFF IN THE 1700 BLOCK OF E. LINDSEY STREET ON MAY 7 AT 5:18PM. NPD RECEIVED A CALL CONCERNING AN ASSAULT. THE REPORTING PARTY DESCRIBED A FEMALE VICTIM WITH SIGNIFICANT INJURIES IN THE RESIDENCE WITH A MALE SUSPECT WHO WAS POSSIBLY ARMED. OFFICERS ATTEMPTED TO CONTACT THE SUSPECT ONCE ON SCENE AND SAW HIM RUN BACK INTO THE APARTMENT. A PERIMETER WAS ESTABLISHED AND NEGOTIATORS BEGAN WORKING TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE SUSPECT. SWAT WAS ACTIVATED AND RESPONDED TO THE SCENE. NEGOTIATORS WERE ABLE TO EVENTUALLY MAKE CONTACT, AND THE SUSPECT EXITED THE APARTMENT PEACEFULLY. HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT INCIDENT. THE VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT. THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED ON COMPLAINTS OF AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - DOMESTIC ABUSE, KIDNAPPING, AND OBSTRUCTION.
- SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS DETECTIVES SEIZED EIGHT POUNDS OF METHAMPHETAMINE AND 70 POUNDS OF MARIJUANA DURING THE COURSE OF TWO SEPARATE INCIDENTS. ALL OF THE DRUGS SEIZED WERE HEADED FOR STATE DISTRIBUTION. INVESTIGATIONS ARE ONGOING.
