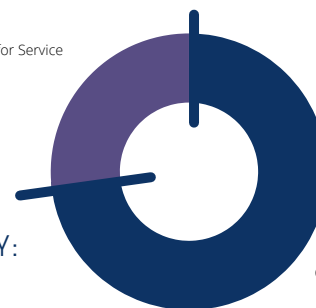

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS ATTEMPTED TO STOP WHAT THEY INITIALLY THOUGHT TO BE AN INTOXICATED DRIVER SWERVING ACROSS LANES IN THE ROADWAY NEAR THE 24TH AND E. LINDSEY. THE SUSPECT VEHICLE ACCELERATED AND CONTINUED TO EXHIBIT THE DRIVING BEHAVIOR OF AN INTOXICATED DRIVER. THE VEHICLE SUBSEQUENTLY STRUCK A GUARDRAIL CAUSING MINOR DAMAGE TO THE RAIL AND DEFLATING A TIRE ON THE VEHICLE. AS AN OFFICER MOVED CLOSE TO ATTEMPT A TVI, THE VEHICLE SLOWED AND STOPPED WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. AFTER THE TWO OCCUPANTS WERE IN CUSTODY IT WAS DISCOVERED THAT THEY WERE BOTH JUVENILES AND THE DRIVER WAS 15 YEARS OLD AND NOT INTOXICATED. THE DRIVER WAS RELEASED TO HIS PARENTS.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A BURGLARY WHERE TWO FIREARMS AND SEVERAL KNIVES WERE STOLEN. THE SUSPECT WAS KNOWN TO THE VICTIM, HAD A CONFIRMED WARRANT, BUT WAS GONE WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED. OFFICERS WERE CALLED BACK TO THE SCENE WHEN THE VICTIM REPORTED THAT THE SUSPECT WAS BACK IN THE DRIVEWAY. THE SUSPECT WAS HIGH ON METH, HAD A GUN TO HIS HEAD AND THREATENED SUICIDE WHEN HE SAW OFFICERS. THE SUSPECT CHALLENGED OFFICERS TO SHOOT HIM AS HE CONTINUED TO HOLD THE HANDGUN TO HIS HEAD. THE SUSPECT WOULD NOT LISTEN TO COMMANDS AND MADE FURTIVE MOVEMENTS IN AN ATTEMPT TO MAKE OFFICERS SHOOT HIM. NEGOTIATORS AND UAS OPERATORS RESPONDED TO ASSIST. OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO DE-ESCALATE THE INCIDENT BY USING A LESS LETHAL SHOTGUN TO PLACE THE SUSPECT INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT.
- ADDITIONAL CRITICAL INCIDENTS DURING THE WEEK INVOLVED: 3 FOUND BODIES, 1 CAR JACKING, 1 KIDNAPPING, 2 MOLESTATIONS, 2 SEXUAL ASSAULTS, AND 1 SHOOTING.
