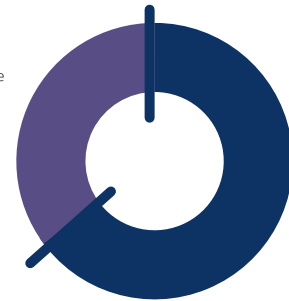

WEEK IN REVIEW

- ANIMAL WELFARE TOOK 85 NEW ANIMALS INTO THE FACILITY. 49 ANIMALS WERE ADOPTED AND 4 WERE RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS. THE FACILITY CONTINUES TO OPERATE AT CRITICAL CAPACITY WITH 250 ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN THEIR CARE.
- TWO DETECTIVES RECEIVED MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDALS FOR AN APRIL INVESTIGATION THAT LEAD TO A HIGH-RISK ARREST AND THE RECOVERY OF MORE THAN A POUND OF DRUGS (INCLUDING METHAMPHETAMINE AND FENTANYL) AS WELL AS 9 STOLEN, HIGH POWERED FIREARMS WITH MORE THAN 1,000 ROUNDS OF AMMUNITION.
- OFFICERS ASSISTED OCPD AS THEY ATTEMPTED TO STOP AN ARMED KIDNAPPING SUSPECT WHO WAS DRIVING SOUTH ON I-35. THE VICTIM WAS STILL INSIDE THE SUSPECT'S VEHICLE, AND THE SUSPECT HAD STABBED ANOTHER PERSON PRIOR TO THE KIDNAPPING. OFFICERS TOOK THE SUSPECT INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT INCIDENT JUST SOUTH OF OUR CITY. THE VICTIM SUSTAINED ONLY MINOR INJURIES DURING THE INCIDENT. OFFICERS ALSO RECOVERED THE WEAPON NEARBY.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO AN INJURY COLLISION IN THE 600 BLOCK OF W. TECUMSEH RD. INVOLVING A MOTORCYCLIST. PRELIMINARY INFORMATION IS THAT THE MOTORCYCLE AND ANOTHER VEHICLE WERE TRAVELING SIDE-BY-SIDE WHEN THE VEHICLE CHANGED LANES, CAUSING THE MOTORCYCLIST TO LOSE CONTROL WHILE TAKING EVASIVE MANEUVERS. THE MOTORCYCLIST WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL WITH SERIOUS INJURIES.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE 300 BLOCK OF EMELYN ST. FOR A FIGHT WITH SHOTS FIRED. THE SUSPECTS FLED THE AREA IN A VEHICLE PRIOR TO THE ARRIVAL OF OFFICERS, EVIDENCE OF SHOTS BEING FIRED WAS FOUND AT THE SCENE. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
