

APRIL 28 - MAY 3, 2022 NORMAN POST ELECTION

This survey was conducted from April 28 - May 3, 2022 and included a pool of 400 voters who participated in the Normal election on April 5, 2022. These survey results were weighted based on age, gender, and party affiliation. This survey has a margin of error of 4.86% at a 95% confidence interval. The poll surveyed both cell phones and landlines and used a combination of live callers and an online sample of voters.

NORMAN POST ELECTION SUMMARY

AMBER INTEGRATED CONDUCTED A QUANTITATIVE POST-ELECTION SURVEY FOR THE CITY OF NORMAN. THE ELECTION STUDIED WAS THE MUNICIPAL ELECTION FROM APRIL 5, 2022. THE STUDY SURVEYED 400 NORMAN VOTERS WHO TOOK PART IN THE MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS ON APRIL 5, 2022. THESE RESULTS HAVE A MARGIN OF ERROR OF 4.86% AT A 95% CONFIDENCE INTERVAL. THE SURVEY WAS IN THE FIELD COLLECTING DATA FROM APRIL 28 - MAY 3, 2022. THE RESULTS HAVE BEEN WEIGHTED BY AGE, GENDER, AND POLITICAL AFFILIATION TO CLOSELY REFLECT THE SENTIMENTS OF THE VOTERS WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE APRIL 5, 2022, ELECTION.

THE PURPOSE OF THE SURVEY WAS TO DETERMINE WHY NORMAN VOTERS REJECTED AN INCREASE IN UTILITY RATES TO PAY FOR IMPROVEMENT IN WATER INFRASTRUCTURE, TREATMENT, AND METERING. THE VOTE TO APPROVE THE INCREASE FAILED 54.6% TO 45.4%

THE TOP 3 REASONS CITED FOR VOTING NO ON THE SURVEY WERE: 1) 25% OF INDIVIDUALS WHO VOTED NO STATED THAT COSTS WERE ALREADY TOO HIGH AND/OR THEY COULDN'T AFFORD THE INCREASE. 2) 21% OF INDIVIDUALS WHO VOTED NO EXPRESSED A GENERAL DISTRUST IN GOVERNMENT AS THE MAIN REASON FOR VOTING NO. 3) 14% OF INDIVIDUALS WHO VOTED NO BELIEVED THAT THERE WERE AREAS OF WASTEFUL SPENDING THAT COULD BE ADDRESSED FIRST AND USED FOR THESE PURPOSES BEFORE GOING TO RATEPAYERS AND ASKING FOR AN INCREASE.

A SIGNIFICANT DECIDING FACTOR FOR SUPPORT OR OPPOSITION SEEMED TO BE PARTISANSHIP. 57% OF REPUBLICAN VOTERS OPPOSED THE RATE INCREASE WHILE ONLY 38% SUPPORTED IT. FURTHER 66% OF INDEPENDENT VOTERS OPPOSED THE RATE INCREASE WHILE ONLY 32% SUPPORTED IT. DEMOCRATIC VOTERS WERE THE ONLY BLOCK TO SUPPORT THE RATE INCREASE WITH 66% SUPPORTING THE MEASURE AND 32% OPPOSING IT.

MOST VOTERS SURVEYED (79%) WERE AWARE OF THE MAIN USE OF FUNDS BEING REQUESTED IN THE RATE INCREASE. THEREFORE, THIS DOESN'T SEEM TO BE AN ISSUE OF UNDERSTANDING, BUT RATHER OF TRUST IN CITY GOVERNMENT. NEARLY 50% OF VOTERS STATED THAT THEY HAVE "LITTLE" OR "NO" TRUST IN CITY GOVERNMENT.

TRUST IN CITY GOVERNMENT IS BY FAR THE MOST STRONGLY CORRELATED FACTOR IN DETERMINING IF A VOTER WERE GOING TO VOTE FOR THE RATE INCREASE.



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












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WHICH PROJECT WAS MOST IMPORTANT TO YOU?

VERBATIM ANSWERS TO QUESTION

Why did you vote this way?

- I panicked and didn't understand the proposal or how it would affect me.
- Because wages are not keeping up with inflation.
- Mismanagement and favoritism displayed on a regular basis by elected leaders. Council is more interested in their own and political self interests.
- Taxes are high enough in Norman
- Charge builders the full connection fee; rate payers should not subsidize them.
- Find the money needed in other areas of overspending....just like voters do in their personal lives!!
- To many taxes
- Didn't really know what it was about, didn't do my own research, generally opposed to paying more for something that humans cannot live without
- I read reports that there was no connection rate increase for businesses, instead putting all the increase on homeowners. I believe the businesses should also contribute to the increases.
- We are on well water
- They are always asking for more money and not saying why they need it or if it's optional vs essential.
- Did not want it
- City council has too much control over the money. Put ALL of the funds towards the problem.
- We already pay some of the highest taxes in the state. I do not want to increase our taxes.

- The city has repeatedly earned the distrust of its citizens by the mismanagement of funds and using misguided at best political doctrine to direct policy.
- I didn't feel like I knew enough to vote for an increase.

Fixing what we already have before growing is what I would like to see and investing in growing Norman local businesses instead of just growing the size of Norman new development.
