


Utilizing Parking Spaces for Outdoor Dining during COVID

Background

- Across the country, cities are getting creative to help small businesses impacted by COVID-19 restrictions
- A number of cities have been utilizing parking lots/spaces to extend the dining areas for restaurants
 - Allows for spacing
 - Additional capacity

Boulder, CO

- Temporary Outdoor Expansion in public ROW and private spaces allowed for a number of commercial uses (restaurants, retail, office, personal service, etc.)
- Revocable permits required issued by CM evaluated based on:
 - Public health, safety, welfare impacts
 - Balance of needs of commercial uses to have an economically viable use with needs of surrounding property owners
 - Access to utility infrastructure
 - Adequate access through the area
 - Health/convenience of business, employees, customers, residents/visitors
 - Term of permit; hours of operation
 - Impacts to others in the area
- Initial order expires September 30



Ft. Collins, CO

- Temporary Outdoor Expansion on City or private property adjacent to or in the immediate vicinity of the fixed location for restaurants, liquor licensed establishments and retail establishment
- Revocable permits required issued by City Engineer evaluated based on:
 - Up to date on all licensing, City requirements
 - Closure is safe
 - Sufficiently mitigates impact to the public's ability to safely and conveniently bypass the proposed closure
 - Compliance with applicable laws, including ADA
 - Maintains adequate emergency access
 - Compatible with other activities in the vicinity
- Order expires on September 27



Stillwater, OK

- Temporary Outdoor Expansion in adjacent public ways and parking lots allowed for restaurants and bars
- Revocable Permit required issued by CM evaluated based on:
 - Permanent location within Stillwater; up to date on all licensing and permits; general liability insurance to indemnify the City
 - Extended service area is limited to immediately adjacent sidewalk, on-street parking area, and/or private lot
 - Enclosed by physical barrier to separate service area from public ROW and deny access to persons who aren't customers
 - Tables, chairs and equipment within barriers must be physically distanced
 - ADA access into extended service area.
- Order expires November 30



Existing Norman Ordinances/Processes

 Special Event permits: outdoor festivals, gatherings, etc anticipated to last more than 2 hours, open to the public, with 1000 or more people anticipated to attend.



 Allows for street closures, barricades, to operate the special event area

Existing Norman Ordinances/Processes

- Parking Variances
 - evaluated by PD
 - Must still allow adequate emergency and pedestrian access

- Sidewalk Dining
 - Allows restaurants to have outside food service adjacent to business
 - Must maintain public access along the sidewalk



Issues to Consider

- Safety
 - Accessible pedestrian access
 - Dining Areas must be protected from traffic
- Loss of public parking
- License
 - ABLE license "licensed premises" includes adjacent premises if in the control of the licensee and used in connection with the business
 - Sidewalk?
- Coordination with adjacent properties



Issues to Consider

Process

- Revocable Permit
- Safety Barriers
- Adequate Access to Expansion Area and around it
- Social distancing
- Insurance/Indemnification
- Who approves? Evaluation by PD and Public Works a must
- Expiration Date (mask ordinance sunsets November 30)
