#### PRESENTATION BY STAFF

Mr. Stenis presented the staff report, a copy of which is filed with the minutes. There were no protests filed on this application.

Mr. Saxion asked for further clarification on the "static" sign. Mr. Stenis explained that the text on the sign will be static. Mr. Koscinski noted staff's recommendation that a static message be a condition of the approval.

Mr. Saxion expressed concern about glare from the sign. Mr. Koscinski explained that the sign ordinance has lighting standards, and the new lighting ordinance therefore didn't address that. The applicant will comply with the requirements of the sign ordinance.

Mr. Ryan asked if the reason this site is allowed two signs is because of its location on a corner lot. Mr. Koscinski said they could have one sign on each street frontage. Previous boards have allowed this once or twice before. Staff believes it minimizes clutter – instead of two poles and two signs, they would be on one pole, making it more effective and doing no harm to the surrounding neighborhood.

Ms. Farmer asked how far below the existing sign this new cabinet will be. Mr. Stenis indicated it will be about 4 inches below the "Sonic" sign. Mr. Sherman noted that the space between the two cabinets counts as part of the sign. This configuration also conforms to the Porter overlay district, which wanted to keep as much of the commercial advertising off the side streets as possible.

### PRESENTATION BY THE APPLICANT

Drew Ratcliff, representing the applicant, indicated staff has covered the request. He asked if he would need to provide any additional information to staff. Mr. Stenis responded that he has the information he needs.

## DISCUSSION AND ACTION BY THE BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

Jim Ruhl moved to grant the Variance to allow a larger ground sign in lieu of a second ground sign on the additional street frontage for Sonic, located at 705 North Porter Avenue, with the provision that the message board only contain a static message display and that, should the property owner opt to install a second ground sign on Frank Street, this Variance would become void. Margaret Farmer seconded the motion.

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There being no further discussion, a vote was taken with the following result:
