NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE April 25, 2016

The Norman Animal Welfare Center Oversight Committee of the City of Norman, Cleveland County, State of Oklahoma, met in the Multi-Purpose room on the 25th day of April, 2016, at 6:00 p.m. The notice and agenda of the meeting were posted in the Municipal Building at 201 West Gray Street on the 21st of April, 2016. The meeting was also posted on the City of Norman website.

I. <u>CALL TO ORDER.</u>

Chairperson Mark Howery called the meeting to order at approximately 6:02 p.m.

II. <u>ROLL CALL.</u>

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT:

Chairperson Mark Howery Jayne Crumpley Joe Carter, D. V. M. Kathryn Schwartz Bierman Rebecca Bean Councilman Stephen Tyler Holman.

Jeanne Snider, Assistant City Attorney Captain Lance Arnold John Bowman, Animal Welfare Supervisor Darci Poe, Norman Animal Welfare Norman Animal Welfare Center Oversight Committee April 25, 2016

III. <u>APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES</u>

<u>A motion to accept the minutes as is was made by Rebecca Bean and seconded by Jayne</u> <u>Crumpley. The motion was carried.</u>

IV. MONTHLY STATISTICS

John Bowman went over the monthly statistics. Chairperson Mark Howery mentioned that the increase in wildlife was from the conference that Wildcare had. Rebecca Bean asked if there will be quarantine room in Phase II. John Bowman answered not unless we have a veterinarian on staff, as it is a requirement of the state statute. John Bowman said we do have an isolation room, but not a quarantine room. Rebecca Bean asked how the owner surrender will be different from here on out. John Bowman answered that with the new ordinance, we will take all animals. Rebecca Bean asked if we will see the numbers that of owner surrenders that are rescheduled. John Bowman said at this time we have not been rescheduling any.

V. <u>CONSTRUCTION UPDATE</u>

John Bowman said the vinyl floors are being installed; they are prepping the floors for sealing the concrete. They are reworking the ceiling grid, surgery lights were put up today, and we are waiting on the flooring. The sod has been put down and looks good. Things are going well. The Ribbon Cutting is scheduled for May 11th at 3pm. There will be a special meeting posted so all the committee members can attend. John Bowman said the cat porch has been poured and installed, but it still needs to be painted and the trim needs to be put around the upper deck and awning part.

Jayne Crumpley asked what the format of the dedication was. Captain Lance Arnold said he had a meeting tomorrow with the city manager and will know more. Jayne said it would be a good opportunity to recognize those who have been involved for years, Dr. Joe Carter, Mark Howery, Kim Fairbanks, and others. Captain Lance Arnold said he would have a better idea tomorrow, and then he could get with her.

VI. DISCUSSION OF ONLINE SYSTEM FOR PET LICENSE SALES

Captain Lance Arnold said we already have Chameleon in place and that is why we first looked at Chameleon; however, because of the \$10,000 set up fee plus the annual fee, he looked at other options. He said he contacted three or four other groups that have the software. Captain Lance Arnold said PetData is in Farmersbranch, Texas. All they do is city pet licensing. He said Elk City uses them. He said it is a full outsource company; they do the mailing, reminders, payments. He said it does not prohibit our vets from selling them or people walking in to purchase one. Captain Lance Arnold said their startup fee is \$1,000.00. PetData has a 24 hours a day, 7 days a week hotline, and the letters and forms would have our logo on it. He said he tried to

contact Pawsy from Seattle but had no answer back. He said they are similar to Chameleon but all centers are based in Washington. He said outsourcing could take a load off of staff; at any one time there could be eight to nine people entering city pet license data. Outsourcing could be a benefit. Kathryn Schwartz Bierman asked if PetData included a donation option. Captain Lance Arnold answered that they do; it is included on their screen. Rebecca Bean asked if we can set a maximum amount for the donations. Captain Lance Arnold answered yes. Rebecca Bean asked if they saw compliance going up in the cities that use that program. Captain Lance Arnold answered yes. Jayne Crumpley said it seems too good to be true. Rebecca Bean asked what the potential downsides are. Captain Lance Arnold said he has not found any yet. He said he will read the proposal, then the next step would be to reach out to those Rebecca Bean asked if people could donate without cities that use PetData. purchasing a city pet license. Captain Lance Arnold said that would be a separate service. Dr. Joe Carter said it sounds like this is a win on several levels, both as a revenue source and taking the burden off of staff; he would like to make a motion to move forward. Assistant City Attorney Jeanne Snider said she wondered if we need a Request for Proposal. She said she will work with Captain Lance Arnold on the process. She suggested to Chairperson Mark Howery that this be put on the next month's agenda. Dr. Joe Carter said we want to encourage the city to move forward with this.

VII. UPDATE AND DISCUSSION OF VOLUNTEER/HUMANITARIAN AWARD

Chairperson Mark Howery said we had a discussion on setting up a work group; our work group is going to be Rebecca Bean and Jennifer Kidney. Rebecca Bean said that Jennifer couldn't meet with her for a couple a weeks, so she and Kathryn Schwartz Bierman got a jump start and this is what we came up with. She had a hand out for everyone (included in posted minutes). Kathryn Schwartz Bierman said they went to look at other humanitarian awards; she said there are a variety of ways to do this. She said she took some of the criteria and tailored it to Norman. Rebecca Bean said they tried to take into consideration comments from the last month's meeting. There was a discussion on how long the nominations should be open and when it would be announced. Assistant City Attorney Jeanne Snider said that calling it a humanitarian award makes it seem like a human rights award; it is confusing. Jayne Crumpley said she likes "volunteer award" better. Rebecca Bean said her only hesitation with the word volunteer is that people may not work in or at the shelter but still help the shelter in other ways. Rebecca Bean said she would strike the word humanitarian. Dr. Joe Carter said there should be two different sets of criteria, nomination criteria and selection criteria.

VIII. <u>REVIEW OF CURRENT STRATEGIC PLAN</u>

Chairperson Mark Howery said the current strategic plan was prepared by John Bowman in January or February 2014. He said it outlines the functions of the shelter, staff positions, goals of the shelter, and current personnel. Dr. Joe Carter asked if the plan was reviewed annually. Captain Lance Arnold answered that it should be reviewed every year; however, the department struggles with that because they want to tie it to the fiscal year. There was a discussion about when the fiscal year begins and ends as well a discussion about the process of the budget.

Dr. Joe Carter asked if the \$10,000.00 emergency account is being utilized. John Bowman answered that there is not an emergency medical account; there never has been. John Bowman said there was a conversation about it but there is not an account. Captain Lance Arnold said if an animal comes in that needs treatment, it gets treatment; it doesn't matter what account is used.

Dr. Joe Carter said two meetings ago we talked about what the staffing priorities were. He said it is troubling him if it is not evaluated on an annual basis. He said the committee should have knowledge of this instead of finding out after the fact. Rebecca Beans said we need to focus saving lives.

There was a discussion about positions needed at Animal Welfare and the veterinarian position. Councilman Stephen Holman said council expects to spend \$200,000.00 more on Animal Welfare this year than last year.

Dr. Joe Carter said he would like to see a revised strategic plan by end of this year to have ready in December for the new budget process. Jayne Crumpley asked what the deadline was to get it in. Captain Lance Arnold answered that it depends on the item. Dr. Joe Carter said we should have a draft by September and approved in October so we have the committee's input in November. Dr. Joe Carter said it seems the strategic plan is something the staff works on, and then brings to us. Captain Lance Arnold said it would be developed internally. Chairperson Mark Howery said he agrees that city staff can draft it, but we can be helpful with suggestions. Kathryn Schwartz Bierman asked if we can all look this over, then talk about it in the June meeting. Captain Lance Arnold said he can bring it in pieces to the committees in a rough draft form to get their input. Rebecca Bean said that her only interest is to be advocates for the shelter, not to be here to tell you how to spend money. We want to be here getting the votes.

IX. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>

Chairperson Mark Howery said the committee voted in October on the resolution to take to council. He said it was good to go and will get it to Brenda Hall this week.

Dr. John Otto said he sees the committee is working very well; it has come a long way. He said in regards to the Erica Loftis award, he hopes to get it done this year. He said it needs attention now rather than next year. He encourages having a plaque with the name and picture of the person who receives the award. He said one of his hopes was to get a veterinarian on staff, so this is a great thing to see. He does think a full time veterinarian will be needed in the future. He said he appreciates this group and the employees. He would like to commend the committee and the City of Norman on what has been done. He said in the Kirkpatrick report, Norman is shown to be number one in live release rate; he said we should be very proud of that. He said we have made a huge amount of progress. Jayne Crumpley asked if Dr. Otto could write a letter

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about what Erica Loftis has done. Dr. Otto answered that, yes, he could and that Rebecca would be helpful with that.

Chairperson Mark Howery said he would send the link to Darci for the Kirkpatrick report in case anyone wants a copy.

X. <u>ADJOURNMENT</u>


