WEEK IN REVIEW

- ANIMAL WELFARE TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 77 ANIMALS THIS WEEK. DURING THIS SAME TIME PERIOD, THEY HAD 24 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 14 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS. THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER CURRENTLY HAS 274 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE.
- THE 63RD NORMAN POLICE ACADEMY TOOK THEIR OATHS OF OFFICE ON JUNE 14. THESE SIX OFFICERS HAVE TRANSITIONED TO FIELD TRAINING.
- THE 64TH NORMAN POLICE ACADEMY STARTED ON JUNE 16. THESE 12
 POLICE OFFICER CANDIDATES WILL TAKE PART IN EXTENSIVE TRAINING
 OVER THE NEXT 26 WEEKS.
- PATROL RESPONDED TO REPORT OF AN INJURY, ROLLOVER COLLISION JUST OFF SOUTHBOUND INTERSTATE 35 NEAR THE ROBINSON STREET EXIT ON JUNE 15. WITNESSES REPORTED THAT TWO SUBJECTS RAN FROM THE VEHICLE FOLLOWING THE CRASH. SPEED IS BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN A FACTOR IN THE COLLISION. OHP IS INVESTIGATING.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION INVOLVING A VEHICLE AND MOTORCYCLE IN THE AREA OF 108TH AVE SE AND HWY 9 ON JUNE 14. THE INVOLVED VEHICLE LEFT THE SCENE. OFFICERS LOCATED THE DRIVER NEARBY. THE DRIVER OF THE VEHICLE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY FOR DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE AND LEAVING THE SCENE OF AN INJURY ACCIDENT. THE DRIVER OF THE MOTORCYCLE DECLINED TREATMENT AT THE SCENE.
