## WEEK IN REVIEW

THE DEPARTMENT RESPONDED TO A SHOOTING IN THE 4100 BLOCK OF W. MAIN STREET ON JULY 18. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED ONE ADULT MALE WITH AN APPARENT GUNSHOT WOUND IN THE ROADWAY. OFFICERS AND WITNESSES IMMEDIATELY BEGAN RENDERING AID. THE ADULT MALE WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL WHERE HE LATER DIED FROM INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE INCIDENT. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION indicates that two individuals were driving vehicles on w. main street when THEY STOPPED IN THE ROADWAY AND AN ALTERCATION ENSUED. DURING THE COURSE OF the altercation, one of the individuals produced a firearm and fired at least ONE SHOT HITTING THE OTHER INDIVIDUAL. THE INDIVIDUAL WHO SHOT THE OTHER WAS ARRESTED AND BOOKED INTO THE CLEVELAND COUNTY DETENTION CENTER ON A COMPLAINT OF FIRST DEGREE MURDER. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE NPD CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION.
ON JULY 19, MEMBERS OF THE 64TH NORMAN POLICE ACADEMY ATTENDED A MEMORIAL WORKOUT IN EDMOND FOR FALLEN EDMOND OFFICER CJ NELSON.
NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE PARTNERED WITH DOG IS MY COPILOT ON JULY 19 AND SENT 92 ANIMALS FROM OUR SHELTER TO RESCUES IN WASHINGTON AND OREGON. DESPITE THIS HUGE WIN FOR THE SHELTER AND THE ANIMALS THAT WENT ON THE TRANSPORT, THE SHELTER REMAINS OVER CAPACITY WITH 201 ANIMALS IN OUR CARE.
EARLY ON JULY 22, NPD OFFICERS OBSERVED A FIGHT ON CAMPUS CORNER. AS OFFICERS WERE WORKING TO GET THE SITUATION UNDER CONTROL ONE OFFICER HEARD A LOUD POPPING NOISE FOLLOWED BY A CITIZEN SAYING "HE HAS A GUN." SEVERAL INDIVIDUALS WERE DETAINED WHILE OFFICERS INVESTIGATED. IT WAS EVENTUALLY DETERMINED THAT NO SHOTS HAD BEEN FIRED. NO ARRESTS WERE MADE, BUT ONE SUBJECT WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL BY EMSSTAT FOR A LACERATION TO THE HAND. WE CELEBRATED GRADUATION FOR 30 STUDENTS ON FRIDAY THAT COMPLETED TWO WEEKS OF THE POLICE ACTIVITIES LEAGUE (PAL) CAMP. THANK YOU TO OUR MANY COMMUNITY PARTNERS WHO MAKE PAL POSSIBLE.
