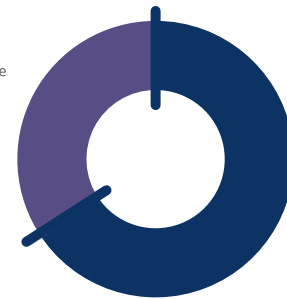

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A DISTURBANCE CALL IN THE 300 BLK OF BEACON AVE ON 10/10. THE REPORTING PARTY STATED THAT A FAMILY MEMBER WAS IN MENTAL HEALTH CRISIS, THREATENING FAMILY MEMBERS, AND CURRENTLY LOOKING FOR A KNIFE. OFFICERS SECURED THE EXTERIOR OF THE HOME AND ASSISTED WITH GETTING ALL OTHER OCCUPANTS OF THE HOME OUT SAFELY. THE SUBJECT WAS LATER TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT INCIDENT FOR THREATENING AN ACT OF VIOLENCE AND ATTEMPTED ARSON. HE WAS TRANSPORTED FOR FURTHER EVALUATION AND TREATMENT.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A DISTURBANCE IN THE 2900 BLK OF SLIDER CT ON 10/12. THE TWO VICTIMS STATED THE SUSPECT ASSAULTED AND THREATENED THEM WITH A HANDGUN OVER THE COURSE OF 24 HOURS BEFORE THEY ESCAPED AND CALLED THE POLICE. THE SUSPECT REMAINED INSIDE THE RESIDENCE WITH ACCESS TO MULTIPLE FIREARMS. INITIAL EFFORTS TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE SUSPECT WERE UNSUCCESSFUL. SWAT WAS ACTIVATED AND, AFTER 3 HOURS OF ATTEMPTED NEGOTIATIONS, OFFICERS BREACHED THE FRONT DOOR AND TOOK THE SUBJECT INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. THE SUSPECT WAS BOOKED INTO CCDC ON COMPLAINTS OF THREATENING AN ACT OF VIOLENCE AND FELONIOUS POINTING OF A FIREARM.
- PATROL RESPONDED TO A CALL FROM A SUICIDAL SUBJECT AT THE TWIN BRIDGES THREATENING TO SHOOT HIMSELF. AS THEY WERE RESPONDING, OFFICERS LEARNED THE SUSPECT HAD RETURNED TO HIS RESIDENCE AND GOT INTO A VEHICLE. OFFICERS STOPPED THE VEHICLE AND PLACED THE SUBJECT INTO CUSTODY FOR FURTHER EVALUATION AND TREATMENT.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 18 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 15 RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. THEY TOOK IN 34 ADDITIONAL ANIMALS AND CURRENTLY HAVE 211 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE, 74 OF THOSE IN FOSTER PLACEMENT.
