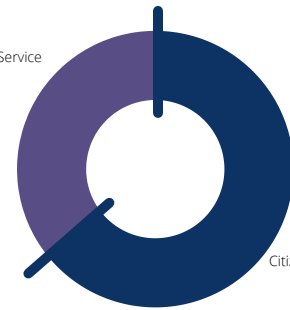

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE IN THE 1100 BLOCK OF CEDARCREST ST ON 1/10. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS FOUND AN ADULT VICTIM WITH MULTIPLE FACIAL INJURIES. THE SUSPECT HAD LEFT THE AREA BUT WAS QUICKLY LOCATED FOLLOWING A REPORTED VEHICLE COLLISION WITH INJURY IN THE 1200 BLOCK OF KINGSTON ROAD. OFFICERS CONFIRMED THE DRIVER INVOLVED IN THE COLLISION TO BE THE SUSPECT FROM THE DISTURBANCE. THE SUSPECT WAS INTOXICATED AND HAD CRASHED THROUGH A FENCE AND INTO A HOUSE. HE WAS ARRESTED ON MULTIPLE CHARGES RELATED TO DOMESTIC ABUSE AND DUI.
- OFFICERS WERE CALLED TO A BURGLARY IN THE 1600 BLK OF ALAMEDA ST ON 1/11. A 13-YEAR-OLD RESIDENT WOKE UP TO SOMEBODY TRYING TO CLIMB THROUGH THEIR BEDROOM WINDOW. THE SUSPECT WAS WEARING ALL BLACK WITH A MASK AND HAD LONGER HAIR. THE SUSPECT MADE NOISE WHILE ATTEMPTING TO ENTER THE APARTMENT AND THE 13-YEAR-OLD YELLED, SCARING THEM AWAY. THE SUSPECT THEN LEFT THE AREA. THE CASE REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO AN INJURY COLLISION IN THE 6400 BLK OF 156TH AVE NE ON 1/12. A SINGLE VEHICLE LOST CONTROL AND ROLLED MULTIPLE TIMES CAUSING THE DRIVER TO BE EJECTED. THE DRIVER WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY CIRT.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 32 ANIMALS ADOPTED, EIGHT ANIMALS TRANSFERRED OUT TO RESCUE, AND FIVE ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 45 ANIMALS. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 131 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 35 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
