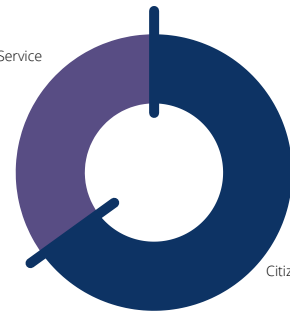

WEEK IN REVIEW

- COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED A REPORT OF AN ATV INCIDENT ON THE CANADIAN RIVER AT THE WEST END OF ROBINSON ST ON 06/30. AN ATV SANK IN THE RIVER WITH 2 ADULTS AND 2 CHILDREN INSIDE. THE ADULTS WERE NOT ABLE TO GET THE CHILDREN OUT. OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO EXTRICATE THE CHILDREN AND GET THEM TO PARAMEDICS. 1 CHILD WAS DECLARED DECEASED AND THE OTHER WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL IN SERIOUS CONDITION.
- ON 07/05 A RESIDENT REPORTED THAT A FRIEND, WHO WAS STAYING THE NIGHT AT THEIR APPARTMENT, HAD 3 WARRANTS FOR LEWD ACTS TO A CHILD. THE RESIDENT SAID THE SUSPECT WOULD COMMIT SUICIDE BY COP IF CONTACTED, BUT WANTED THE SUSPECT ARRESTED. OFFICERS OBSERVED THE SUSPECT INSIDE THE APARTMENT, BUT THE SUSPECT WOULD NOT RESPOND TO MULTIPLE ATTEMPTS FOR CONTACT. OFFICERS PREPARED TO MAKE ENTRY WITH A K9, THE SUSPECT HEARD THE K9 AND SURRENDERED WITHOUT INCIDENT.
- OFFICERS WERE DISPATCHED TO AN INJURY COLLISION AT LINN ST AND FINDLAY AVE ON 07/05. THE COLLISION INVOLVED A TRUCK AND BICYCLE. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATED THE BICYCLIST RAN A STOP SIGN AND TURNED INTO THE PATH OF THE TRUCK. THE RIDER WAS TAKEN TO AN AREA HOSPITAL WITH LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY CIRT.
- OFFICERS OBSERVED A REPORTED STOLEN VEHICLE IN THE 1100 BLK OF W MAIN ST ON 07/05. THE VEHICLE WAS DRIVING ERRATICALLY, EVENTUALLY STOPPED AT COMANCHE ST AND PICKARD AVE. THE DRIVER FLED ON FOOT AND THE PASSENGER WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. A PERIMETER WAS SET UP, A DRONE WAS DEPLOYED, AND THE DRIVER WAS FOUND AND TAKEN INTO CUSTODY. BOTH OCCUPANTS WERE IDENTIFIED AS JUVENILES. THERE WERE NO INJURIES OR DAMAGE.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 14 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 17 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 49 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 204 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 56 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
