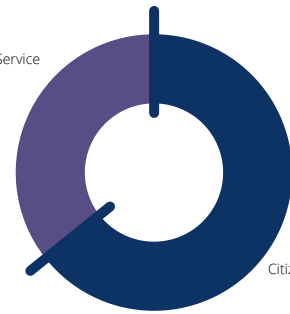

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A ROBBERY IN THE 1300 BLOCK OF E. LINDSEY ON 7/14. INITIAL REPORT INDICATE THAT THE SUSPECT ENTERED THE STORE, POINTED A FIREARM AT THE CLERK, AND DEMANDED MONEY. THE SUSPECT THEN LEFT THE SCENE BEFORE RECEIVING THE ITEMS. NO INJURIES WERE REPORTED. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS FROM THE SCHOOL RESOURCE SECTION HOSTED THE ANNUAL POLICE ATHLETIC LEAGUE CAMP THIS JULY. THIS EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCE WAS GEARED TOWARDS YOUNG TEENS TO HELP PROMOTE PERSONAL AND COMMUNITY VALUES TO THE ATTENDEES AS THEY INTERACTED WITH OFFICERS. THIS YEAR, THE EVENT WAS A HUGE SUCCESS AS THE SROS MENTORED NEARLY 40 TEENS. NPD WOULD LIKE TO THANK ALL 31 INDIVIDUALS AND ORGANIZATIONS WHO DONATED TO THE PROGRAM.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 42 ANIMALS ADOPTED, ONE ANIMAL TRANSFERRED TO RESCUE AND THREE ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 82 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 232 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 49 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.

NEW CUSTOMER SERVICE TOOL - SPIDRTECH

NPD LAUNCHED A NEW COMMUNICATION TOOL THAT ALLOWS NORMAN RESIDENTS AND VISITORS TO RECEIVE UPDATES ON THEIR EMERGENCY AND NON-EMERGENCY CALLS FOR POLICE SERVICE VIA TEXT MESSAGE ON JULY 23.

THE NEW CUSTOMER SERVICE TOOL INITIATES AN AUTOMATED MESSAGE WITH THE PRIMARY CALLER VIA TEXT ACKNOWLEDGING RECEIPT OF THE REQUEST FOR SERVICE. NPD OFFICERS WILL RESPOND AND PROVIDE ASSISTANCE FOLLOWING TRADITIONAL PROTOCOLS.

THE COMMUNICATION PROCESS WILL CONTINUE THROUGH THE LIFE CYCLE OF THE INCIDENT. UPON CLOSURE OF THE INCIDENT OR CASE, THE CALLER WILL BE PROMPTED TO COMPLETE A SHORT SURVEY REGARDING THEIR INTERACTION WITH NPD. LEARN MORE AT: NORMANPD.NORMANOK.GOV.
