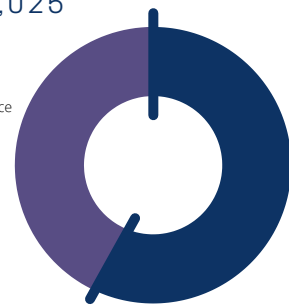

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF SUSPICIOUS INDIVIDUALS CHECKING CAR DOORS IN THE 300 BLK OF POTOMAC DR ON 12/1. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS OBSERVED 1 SUBJECT GETTING OUT OF A VEHICLE, WHEN CONFRONTED, THE SUBJECT FLED ON A BIKE. ANOTHER SUSPECT WAS ALSO OBSERVED AND FLED WHEN CONFRONTED. OFFICERS CAUGHT THE SUPECT ON THE BIKE AND RECOVERED A LOADED FIREARM AS WELL AS STOLEN PROPERTY. THE OTHER SUSPECT WAS SEEN HIDING IN A NEARBY APARTMENT COMPLEX, BUT AGAIN FLED. SEVERAL STOLEN ITEMS WERE LOCATED WHERE THE SUSPECT HAD BEEN HIDING. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A FIGHT INVOLVING MULTIPLE PEOPLE AND A REPORTED FIREARM IN THE CAMPUS CORNER AREA ON 12/7. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED ONE INVOLVED SUBJECT WHO WAS UNCOOPERATIVE. THE OFFICERS CALLED FOR ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE TO TAKE THE INDIVIDUAL INTO CUSTODY. THE SUBJECT RECEIVED MEDICAL EVALUATION BEFORE BEING BOOKED INTO THE CLEVELAND COUNTY DETENTION CENTER ON MULTIPLE CHARGES.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 32 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 10 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN 62 ANIMALS AND CURRENTLY HAVE 133 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE. 25 OF THOSE ANIMALS ARE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
