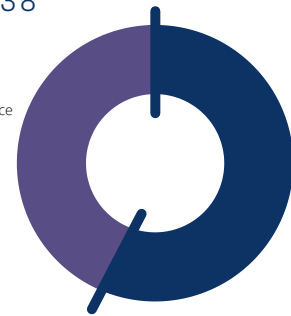

### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO REPORT OF A JUVENILE RUNAWAY WITH SPECIAL NEEDS IN THE 200 BLK OF NE INTERSTATE DR ON 12/8. OFFICERS QUICKLY LOCATED THE CHILD SAFE AT A NEARBY BUSINESS AND RETURNED THE CHILD TO THEIR CAREGIVERS.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A KNIFE AT A RESIDENCE IN THE 1200 BLOCK OF WINDSOR WAY ON 12/9. PRIOR TO OFFICERS ARRIVING, WITNESSES REPORTED SHOTS BEING FIRED AND THAT A RESIDENT, ALONG WITH THEIR CHILD, RAN FROM THE RESIDENCE AND WENT TO A NEIGHBOR'S HOUSE. AS OFFICERS APPROACHED THE RESIDENCE, A SUBJECT STARTING SHOOTING THROUGH THE FRONT DOOR INTO NEIGHBORING HOUSES AND VEHICLES. OFFICERS SET UP A PERIMETER AND WERE ABLE TO TALK THE SUBJECT OUT OF THE RESIDENCE. THE JUVENILE SUBJECT WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. AFTER ENSURING THERE WERE NO INJURIES IN THE RESIDENCE OR NEIGHBORING HOUSES, THE SUBJECT WAS TAKEN TO THE COUCH DETENTION FACILITY ON COMPLAINTS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE BY STRANGULATION AND RECKLESS CONDUCT WITH A FIREARM.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF AN INJURY COLLISION IN THE 1200 BLOCK OF ALAMEDA INVOLVING A VEHICLE AND BICYCLIST ON 12/9. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THE BICYCLIST FAILED TO YIELD AND WAS STRUCK BY A VEHICLE. THE BICYCLIST WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT FOR NON-LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 38 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 1 ANIMAL TRANSFERRED OUT TO RESCUE, AND 4 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 72 ANIMALS. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 147 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 25 OF THOSE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
