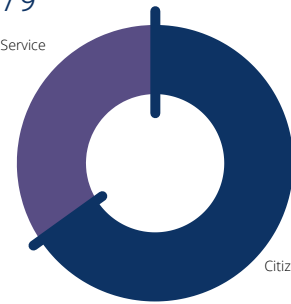

WEEK IN REVIEW

- COMMUNITY MEMBERS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT FROM ACROSS THE STATE CAME TOGETHER TO REMEMBER AND HONOR THE LIFE OF MASTER POLICE OFFICER JENNY BRYAN WHO SERVED THE CITY OF NORMAN FOR EIGHT YEARS. MPO BRYAN WAS A DEDICATED MEMBER OF OUR PATROL AND TRAINING DIVISIONS, SERVING AS AN INSTRUCTOR AND ON NUMEROUS SPECIAL TEAMS. MPO BRYAN PASSED AWAY ON DEC. 30 FOLLOWING A LONG AND COURAGEOUS BATTLE AGAINST CANCER. SHE FOUGHT THIS COURAGEOUS BATTLE AGAINST CANCER WITH THE SAME STRENGTH, RESILIENCE, AND COMMITMENT THAT MARKED HER SERVICE TO NPD AND OUR COMMUNITY.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SINGLE VEHICLE INJURY COLLISION AT THE INTERSECTION OF MAIN ST AND BERRY RD ON 1/6. THE DRIVER WAS ARRESTED AT THE SCENE FOR DUI AND THE PASSENGER WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL IN CRITICAL CONDITION. THE PASSENGER LATER PASSED AWAY DUE TO INJURIES SUSTAINED. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE CIRT TEAM.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 30 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 8 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER THIS WEEK. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK A TOTAL OF 24 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 110 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 16 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
