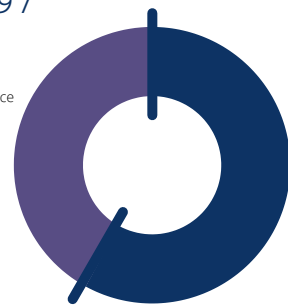

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORTED ROBBERY OUTSIDE OF A RESIDENCE IN THE 1300 BLOCK OF BILOXI DR ON 1/12. OFFICERS CONTACTED THE VICTIM WHO TOOK THEM TO THE SCENE, AND OFFICERS OBSERVED THE SUSPECT DRIVING AWAY. OFFICERS STOPPED THE VEHICLE, BUT THEIR INITIAL INVESTIGATION REVEALED INCONSISTENT FACTS. THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED FOR AN UNRELATED TRAFFIC CHARGE. THE REPORTED ROBBERY REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A VEHICLE COLLISION IN THE 3700 BLK OF BLACK MESA RD ON 1/12. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT A SMALL SUV LEFT THE ROADWAY, DROVE THROUGH A YARD, STRUCK A VEHICLE PARKED IN A DRIVEWAY, AND THEN COLLIDED WITH A HOUSE. NO ONE IN THE HOUSE WAS INJURED AND THERE WAS NO SIGNIFICANT STRUCTURAL DAMAGE. UPON CONTACT, OFFICERS RECOGNIZED SIGNS THAT THE DRIVER WAS IMPAIRED. AN OPEN CONTAINER WAS ALSO LOCATED INSIDE THE VEHICLE. THE DRIVER TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT FOR INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE COLLISION. A WARRANT WAS REQUESTED FOR THE DRIVER ON COMPLAINTS OF DUI AND CHILD ENDANGERMENT.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 35 ANIMALS ADOPTED, 2 ANIMALS TRANSFERRED TO RESCUES, AND 5 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN 55 ANIMALS THIS WEEK. THEY CURRENTLY HAVE 127 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 21 OF THOSE ANIMALS IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
