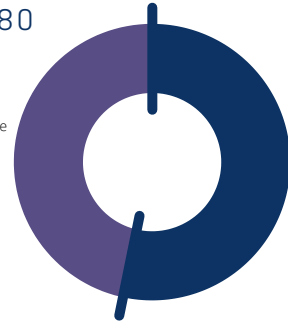

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A COLLISION INVOLVING AN AMTRAK TRAIN AT THE CEDAR LANE RAILROAD CROSSING ON 1/21. THE DRIVER OF THE VEHICLE WAS TRANSPORTED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL FOR NON-LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- OFFICERS TOOK A REPORT OF A MISSING PERSON ON 1/23. INITIAL INFORMATION INDICATED THE INDIVIDUAL COULD BE IN DANGER DUE TO RECENT BEHAVIOR AND ACTIVITY. INVESTIGATIVE FOLLOW-UPS RESULTED IN THE INDIVIDUAL BEING LOCATED SAFE SEVERAL HOURS AFTER THE INITIAL REPORT.
- MEMBERS OF THE NORMAN POLICE DEPARTMENT PARTICIPATED IN THE NORMAN POLAR PLUNGE EVENT ON 1/25. THE EVENT WAS HELD IN SUPPORT OF THE OKLAHOMA SPECIAL OLYMPICS. OUR TEAMS EFFORTS HELPED CONTRIBUTE TO THE OVERALL AMOUNT RAISED WHICH TOTALED APPROXIMATELY \$13,000.
- FOUR OFFICERS FROM THE 66TH NORMAN POLICE ACADEMY COMPLETED THEIR PROBATIONARY PERIOD ON 1/26. THESE OFFICERS HAVE BEEN ASSIGNED TO PATROL DIVISION II. CONGRATULATIONS!
- THE PACE SECTION CONDUCTED NUMEROUS UNDER 21 PROJECTS THROUGHOUT THE WEEK. OFFICERS FOCUSED ON BUSINESSES THAT SOLD NICOTINE PRODUCTS TO UNDER-AGED INDIVIDUALS. DURING THE PROJECT, 3 BUSINESSES ILLEGALLY SOLD THESE PRODUCTS AND WERE CITED.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 25 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 1 ANIMAL RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN 41 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER THIS WEEK. THEY CURRENTLY HAVE 123 IN THEIR CARE WITH 19 OF THOSE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
