WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO AN ATTEMPTED BURGLARY AT A RESIDENCE IN THE 1600 BLK OF ALAMEDA ST ON 1/29. OFFICERS QUICKLY ESTABLISHED A PERIMETER AND LOCATED THE SUSPECT NEARBY. UPON CONTACT, THE SUSPECT RAN. DURING THE FOOT PURSUIT OFFICERS DEPLOYED THEIR TASER AND THE SUSPECT WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. DURING THE FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION, THE SUSPECT ADMITTED TO THEIR ROLE IN AT LEAST 15 SIMILAR BURGLARY AND ATTEMPTED BURGLARY INCIDENTS OVER THE LAST SEVERAL MONTHS - INCLUDING ONE INCIDENT THAT INVOLVED THE A SEXUAL ASSAULT OF A RESIDENT. THE SUSPECT WAS BOOKED INTO CCDC ON 1 COMPLAINT OF RAPE, 11 COMPLAINTS OF BURGLARY, AND 4 COMPLAINTS OF ATTEMPTED BURGLARY.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORTED SHOOTING IN THE 2800 BLK OF DEWEY AVE ON 1/27. OFFICERS COULD NOT LOCATE EVIDENCE OF A SHOOTING BUT DID DETERMINE THE REPORTED INCIDENT WAS IN REGARD TO A DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE. ONE OF THE INVOLVED PERSONS WAS ARRESTED ON A CHARGE RELATING TO DOMESTIC ABUSE.
- THE 68TH NORMAN POLICE ACADEMY GRADUATED ON 1/30. THE FIVE LATERAL OFFICERS BRING YEARS OF EXPERIENCE FROM PREVIOUS LAW ENFORCEMENT ROLES. ALL WILL NOW BEGIN FIELD TRAINING BEFORE BEING ASSIGNED TO A ROLE WITHIN THE PATROL DIVISION.
- THE NORMAN POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS, ALONG WITH SODEXO, AND NORMAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS, HOSTED THE 49TH ANNUAL CHILI SUPPER BENEFIT DINNER ON 1/30. THE EVENT RAISED OVER \$5,500 AND ALL PROCEEDS WENT TO THE CHRISTMAS STORE OF CLEVELAND COUNTY, WHICH OFFERS A SHOPPING OPPORTUNITY FOR LOW-INCOME PERSONS WHO WISH TO CREATE A MEANINGFUL CHRISTMAS FOR THEIR FAMILIES.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 31 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 13 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNERS. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK 55 ANIMALS INTO CENTER THIS WEEK. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 120 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 18 OF THOSE ANIMALS IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
