

Accepted Items

This list is to give you an idea of the types of products that should come to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility. If you have a product that you are not sure what to do with please give us a call at 405.366.5463.

DO NOT mix products together. Products need to be in their original containers with labels. If you have an unknown product or a product that is no longer in an original container, please let us know before scheduling your appointment. (For more information about gathering your items, please visit the “Gathering & Transporting HHW” link on our homepage.)

Adhesives – such as glues, tile and carpet adhesives, cements, grouts, caulking, resins, fiberglass and epoxies

Aerosol Products – such as spray paints, cleaning products, polishes, automotive products, insecticides, and pesticides



Ammunition – small arms only (If you have other types of ammunition or explosives, please call the non-emergency number for the Police Department, 405.321.1444.)

Automotive Products – such as brake fluids, power steering fluids, transmission fluid, radiator flushes, refrigerants, fuel additives, degreasers, cleaners, and detailers (Please see the “Self-Serve Station” link on our homepage for more information on disposing of motor oil, oil filters, and antifreeze.)

Batteries – such as alkaline, lithium, Ni-Cd, Ni-MH, and lead acid batteries. (We cannot accept swollen or damaged Lithium batteries at this time.)



Corrosive Products – such as acids, bases, bleaches, vinegar, ammonia, drain cleaners, rust removers, and other household products



Fireworks – all types

Flammable Products – (Both liquid and solid forms) such as automotive fluids, solvents, fuels, sealer, lacquers, mothballs, sanitizers, and other household products

Fuels – such as gasoline, diesel, kerosene, butane and other lamp oils (Gasoline and Diesel fuels must be in approved gas containers. We can return your containers if you let us know when scheduling your appointment.)



Helium Tanks – such as those used for party balloons



Home Fire Extinguishers – all sizes and types, with the exception of commercial grade fire extinguishers

Home-Generated Sharps – Sharps should be in an approved sharps container or a hard plastic container with a secure lid, such as a coffee can or laundry detergent bottle. (Please see the “Home-Generated Sharps” link on our homepage for more guidelines about sharps disposal.)



Household Cleaners – such as glass cleaners, oven cleaners, mold & mildew cleaners, laundry products, furniture products, degreasers, abrasive cleaners, ammonia-based cleaners, rust and spot removers, carpet cleaners, deodorizers and disinfectants, floor cleaners, bleach products, toilet and drain cleaners

Light Bulbs – such as fluorescent tubes, compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), incandescent light bulbs, and LED bulbs



Lighters – All styles

Paints > Acrylic / Latex – such as house paints and craft paints (We do ask that you check any acrylic / latex paint before scheduling an appointment. Acrylic / Latex paint is water based so if it is completely dried out, it is no longer hazardous, just pop off the lids and place in the regular trash.)

Paints > Oil Based – Wet or Dry – such as paints, stains, varnishes, lacquers, enamels, and hobbies paints (Please note that oil based paints are flammable/combustible even when dry and should not be placed in the trash.)

Matches – All sizes





Mercury – such as thermometers and thermostats

Oxidizers – such as peroxides, amines, some pool chemicals, and some household products

Pet Products – such as shampoos, flea and tick products, and urine cleaners
(We cannot accept any medicated products at this time, specifically prescription based products.)



Photographic Chemicals

Poisons – (Both liquid and solid forms) such as pesticides, insecticides, herbicides, fungicides, fertilizers, other lawn & garden chemicals, some pet items, and some household products



Pool and Spa Chemicals

Propane Canisters – such as the small camping size (We cannot accept BBQ grill propane tanks.)

Scratch-Top Flares

Sealers – such as tile and grout sealers, waterproofing sealers, and wood sealers.

Solvents – such as mineral spirits, paint thinners, acetones, denatured alcohol, and turpentine
