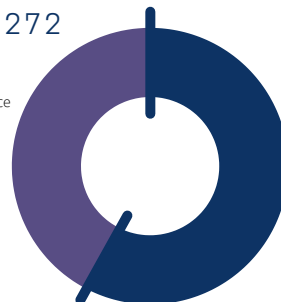

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A SUSPICIOUS PERSON IN THE 3200 BLK OF CONESTOGA DR. ON 02/23. THE CALLER REPORTED A SUSPICIOUS PERSON WAS WALKING AROUND THEIR APARTMENT BUILDING AND TAKING ITEMS FROM THEIR FRONT PORCH. A RESPONDING OFFICER LOCATED A PERSON MATCHING THE DESCRIPTION PROVIDED AND ATTEMPTED CONTACT AS THE SUBJECT WAS ATTEMPTING TO SET A BUSH ON FIRE. THE SUBJECT DID NOT LISTEN TO COMMANDS AND INDICATED THEY WERE GOING TO FLEE. THE OFFICER SUCCESSFULLY DEPLOYED A REMOTE RESTRAINT DEVICE TAKING THE SUBJECT INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. ADDITIONAL OFFICERS ARRIVED AND EXTINGUISHED THE FIRE. THE SUBJECT WAS ARRESTED FOR PUBLIC INTOXICATION, OBSTRUCTION, RESISTING ARREST, AND POSSESSION OF A FAKE ID. A WARRANT FOR ARSON WAS ALSO REQUESTED.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE AREA OF SAM GORDON DR. AND HEARTHSTONE DR. FOR SUSPECTED EXPLOSIVE DEVICE. THE CALLER SAID THEY WERE WALKING IN THE AREA AND SAW WHAT THEY THOUGHT WAS A HAND GRENADE ON THE GROUND NEXT TO A MAILBOX. OFFICERS LOCATED THE DEVICE IN THE 800 BLK. OF CEDARBROOK DR. AN NPD BOMB TECHNICIAN RESPONDED AND, SUBSEQUENT TO AN EXAMINATION, DETERMINED THE DEVICE WAS SAFE BEFORE SEIZING IT FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATION.
- THE NORMAN POLICE DEPARTMENT KICKED OFF THE 22ND CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY THIS PAST WEEK. THIS 11-WEEK COURSE PROVIDES WEEKLY INSIGHT INTO HOW OUR POLICE OFFICERS PERFORM THEIR DUTIES AND HOW THE AGENCY SERVES THE COMMUNITY. THIS CLASS WILL HOST 19 PARTICIPANTS WHO WILL GET A BEHIND THE SCENES LOOK AT POLICE PROCEDURES AND HOW THE AGENCY OPERATES.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 39 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 13 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 83 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER THIS WEEK. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 163 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 21 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
