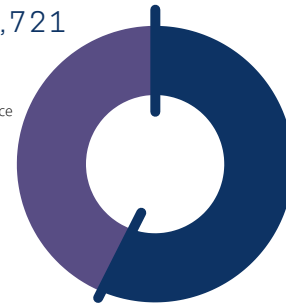

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS STOPPED A VEHICLE IN THE AREA OF 108TH AVE SE AND SH-9 FOR DANGEROUS DRIVING BEHAVIOR CONSISTENT WITH AN IMPAIRED DRIVER ON 3/10. THE OFFICER MADE CONTACT WITH THE SOLE OCCUPANT WHO DISPLAYED SIGNS OF IMPAIRMENT. AFTER BEING ASKED TO STEP OUT OF THE VEHICLE FOR SFSTS, THE DRIVER TOOK OFF EASTBOUND ON SH-9. OFFICERS INITIATED A PURSUIT AND ATTEMPTED MULTIPLE UNSUCCESSFUL TVIS. ON THE FINAL ATTEMPT, THE DRIVER SLAMMED ON HIS BRAKES AND MOVED TOWARD THE OFFICER'S VEHICLE CAUSING A COLLISION. THE POLICE UNIT WAS TEMPORARILY DISABLED. THE OTHER POLICE UNIT CONTINUED THE CHASE UNTIL THE SUSPECT PULLED OVER NEAR 180TH AVE SE AND SH-9 WITH A BLOWNOUT REAR TIRE. OFFICERS GAVE VERBAL COMMANDS BUT THE SUSPECT DID NOT COMPLY. OFFICERS THEN BROKE THE DRIVER'S SIDE WINDOW AND UTILIZED PEPPER SPRAY TO GET THE DRIVER OUT OF THE VEHICLE. ONCE REMOVED, THE DRIVER WAS ARRESTED AND BOOKED INTO CCDC ON COMPLAINTS OF DUI AND ASSAULT WITH A DEADLY WEAPON.
- NUMEROUS FIRES WERE REPORTED DURING EXTREMELY DANGEROUS WEATHER CONDITIONS ON 3/14 PROMPTING EVACUATIONS. INITIAL DAMAGE ESTIMATES ARE THAT 7 HOMES AND 20 OUTBUILDINGS WERE LOST TO FIRES. RESPONDERS FROM NFD, NPD, EMSSTAT, AND OTHER CITY AND COUNTY DEPARTMENTS COORDINATED RESPONSE EFFORTS OUT OF THE ECOC. - OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A COLLISION NEAR HWY 9 AND 132ND AVE SE ON 3/15. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT A TRUCK, DRIVING AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED, CROSSED INTO ONCOMING TRAFFIC, AND COLLIDED WITH ANOTHER VEHICLE. THE DRIVER OF THE TRUCK WAS POSSIBLY INTOXICATED AND WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL WITH MINOR INJURIES. THE DRIVER OF THE OTHER VEHICLE WAS ALSO TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL WHERE THEY LATER DIED AS A RESULT OF INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE COLLISION. A PASSENGER IN THE OTHER VEHICLE DIED AT THE SCENE FROM INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE COLLISION. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE NPD/OPUD CIRT TEAM.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 24 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 9 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN A TOTAL OF 48 ANIMALS INTO THE ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER THIS WEEK. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 131 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 18 OF THOSE ANIMALS CURRENTLY IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
