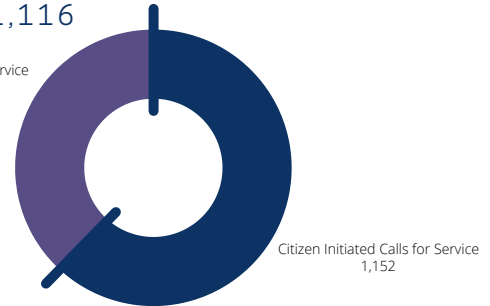

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS ATTEMPTED TO STOP TWO CARS RACING IN THE AREA OF 12TH AVE SE AND CLASSEN BLVD ON 4/6. NEITHER VEHICLE STOPPED AND CONTINUED DRIVING RECKLESSLY AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED. ONE VEHICLE TRIED TO TURN INTO AN APARTMENT COMPLEX BUT CRASHED AT THE ENTRANCE. THE DRIVER CONTINUED EFFORTS TO FLEE AND AT ONE POINT PUT THE CAR INTO REVERSE AND RAMMED A POLICE CAR. OFFICERS WERE EVENTUALLY ABLE TO INTERVENE AND DISABLE THE VEHICLE. BOTH THE DRIVER AND A PASSENGER WERE INTOXICATED. THE DRIVER WAS ARRESTED FOR DUI AND ASSAULT WITH A DANGEROUS WEAPON. THE PASSENGER WAS ALSO ARRESTED.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A COLLISION INVOLVING 2 VEHICLES AT LINDSEY ST. AND TORTOISE WOOD RD ON 4/11. INITIAL INFORMATION INDICATES THAT ONE VEHICLE CROSSED LEFT OF CENTER AND COLLIDED WITH THE OTHER. 3 SUBJECTS WERE TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL WITH 1 OF THOSE SUBJECTS IN CRITICAL CONDITION. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY NPD/OPUD CIRT TEAM.
- MEMBERS OF NPD AND THE MCCLAIN COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PARTICIPATED IN THE BAGGING WITH BADGES EVENT AT HOMELAND GROCERY STORE ON 4/12. THE EVENT RAISED \$600 IN DONATIONS FOR THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS OKLAHOMA.
- DURING THE WEEK, PACE CONDUCTED NUMEROUS UNDER 21 PROJECTS WHERE OFFICERS FOCUSED EFFORTS ON BUSINESSES THAT SOLD NICOTINE PRODUCTS AND ALCOHOL TO UNDER AGED INDIVIDUALS. DURING THE PROJECT, 5 BUSINESSES ILLEGALLY SOLD THESE PRODUCTS AND WERE CITED.
- ANIMAL WELFARE HAD 26 ANIMALS ADOPTED AND 9 ANIMALS RECLAIMED BY THEIR OWNER. ADDITIONALLY, THEY TOOK IN 59 ANIMALS THIS WEEK. THEY CURRENTLY HAVE 138 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 20 OF THOSE IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
