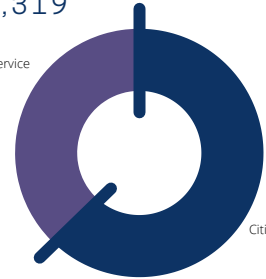

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE AREA OF 12<sup>TH</sup> AVE SE AND GOLDEN EAGLE DR FOR A SUBJECT BREAKING INTO CARS ON 9/10. OFFICERS ATTEMPTED TO CONTACT THE SUBJECT WHO FLED. THE SUBJECT EVENTUALLY TURNED AND WENT HANDS-ON WITH OFFICERS. UPON ARREST, OFFICERS ALSO RECOVERED A LOADED HANDGUN FROM THE INDIVIDUAL. THE SUBJECT WAS IDENTIFIED AS A JUVENILE WITH A PREVIOUS WEAPONS CONVICTION. THE JUVENILE WAS TAKEN TO THE JUVENILE DETENTION FACILITY ON NUMEROUS CHARGES.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A COLLISION INVOLVING A VEHICLE AND PEDESTRIAN AT 36<sup>TH</sup> AVE NW AND W TECUMSEH ROAD ON 9/12. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED AN ADULT FEMALE PEDESTRIAN WHO HAD BEEN HIT BY A VEHICLE. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THE DRIVER OF THE VEHICLE LEFT THE ROADWAY AND STRUCK THE PEDESTRIAN, WHO WAS WALKING NEAR THE SIDE OF THE ROADWAY, BEFORE COLLIDING WITH A POLE. THE PEDESTRIAN AND THE DRIVER OF THE VEHICLE WERE BOTH TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL. THE PEDESTRIAN LATER PASSED AWAY AT THE HOSPITAL FROM INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE COLLISION. THE COLLISION REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE NPD/OPD CIRT TEAM.
- OFFICERS WITH THE SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS SECTION, PACE UNIT, AND THE OKLAHOMA CITY VICE UNIT CONDUCTED A JOINT OPERATION TARGETING REPORTED PROSTITUTION BEING CONDUCTED OUT OF NORMAN MASSAGE PARLORS. THE OPERATION RESULTED IN TWO ARRESTS FOR SOLICITING ACTS OF PROSTITUTION AND OPERATING A MASSAGE PARLOR WITHOUT STATE LICENSE.
