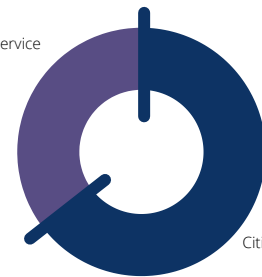

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE AT A RESIDENCE IN THE 2600 BLOCK OF BERRY FARM RD ON 11/2. AS OFFICERS ARRIVED, THEY SAW A VEHICLE LEAVING THE RESIDENCE. OFFICERS FOLLOWED THE VEHICLE WHILE OTHER OFFICERS CONTACTED THE VICTIM WHO HAD NUMEROUS INJURIES. THE VICTIM IDENTIFIED THE SUSPECT AS AN EX-BOYFRIEND WHO BROKE INTO THE HOUSE AND ASSAULTED HER. OFFICERS ATTEMPTED TO CONTACT THE SUSPECT VEHICLE, BUT THE SUSPECT RAN UNTIL THEIR VEHICLE WAS DISABLED. THE SUSPECT THEN RAN FROM OFFICERS CLAIMING TO HAVE A GUN. THE SUSPECT WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. THE VICTIM WAS TREATED AT A LOCAL HOSPITAL FOR INJURIES SUSTAINED IN THE ASSAULT. THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED FOR BURGLARY, DOMESTIC ABUSE IN THE PRESENCE OF A MINOR, ELUDING, DRIVING UNDER SUSPENSION, AND OBSTRUCTION.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE AREA OF LINDSEY ST AND 48<sup>TH</sup> AVE SE ON 11/5 FOR A VEHICLE COLLISION. INITIAL REPORTS WERE THAT AN OCCUPANT WAS TRAPPED INSIDE. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED THEY FOUND A SINGLE VEHICLE HAD DEPARTED THE ROADWAY AND STRUCK A TREE. THE DRIVER (AND SOLE OCCUPANT OF THE VEHICLE) WAS TRAPPED IN THE VEHICLE AND REQUIRED EXTRACTION FROM NORMAN FIRE. ONCE THE VICTIM WAS EXTRICATED THEY WERE DECLARED DECEASED. THE INCIDENT REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION BY THE CIRT TEAM.
- NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ADOPTED OUT 37 ANIMALS, TRANSFERRED 68 TO RESCUE PARTNERS, AND REUNITED 12 WITH THEIR OWNERS. ADDITIONALLY, 51 NEW ANIMALS WERE TAKEN IN DURING THIS PERIOD.
- THIS WEEK INCLUDED A RESCUE FLIGHT WITH DOG IS MY COPILOT THAT SENT 65 ANIMALS TO PARTNER SHELTERS IN COLORADO AND OREGON.
