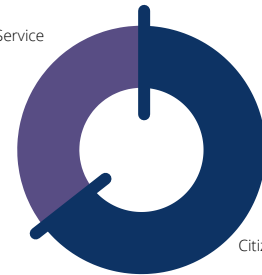

WEEK IN REVIEW

- ON 12/16 PATROL STOPPED A VEHICLE IN AN APARTMENT COMPLEX IN THE 1300 BLK OF 12TH AVE NE BASED ON INFORMATION THAT THEY POSSESSED STOLEN PROPERTY. AS A RESULT OF THE CONTACT, OFFICERS ARRESTED 2 PEOPLE FOR OUTSTANDING WARRANTS AND TRAFFICKING DRUGS. OFFICERS ALSO FOUND A LARGE AMOUNT OF CASH AND A FIREARM.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A STABBING REPORT ON 12/25 IN THE 1800 BLK OF W. ROBINSON ST. THE INITIAL INFORMATION SAID THE INCIDENT WAS ACCIDENTAL, HOWEVER THE SUBJECT STATED OTHERWISE WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED. THE VICTIM WAS TRANSPORTED TO AN AREA HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT OF THEIR INJURIES, AND THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED AND TAKEN TO THE CLEVELAND COUNTY DETENTION CENTER.
- THE DEPARTMENT CONDUCTED AN IMPAIRED DRIVING ENFORCEMENT PROJECT ON 12/26 IN ASSOCIATION WITH OHP AND THE CLEVELAND COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE. THE INTENT WAS TO DISCOURAGE PEOPLE WHO ARE INTOXICATED FROM GETTING BEHIND THE WHEEL OF A MOTOR VEHICLE AND TO ADDRESS THE POSSIBLE HARMS WHICH RESULT FROM PEOPLE WHO DECIDE TO DRIVE WHILE IMPAIRED. OUR EFFORTS RESULTED IN OVER 450 CONTACTS, MULTIPLE CITATIONS, 4 DUI-RELATED ARRESTS, AND 1 DRUG POSSESSION ARREST.
- PATROL RESPONDED TO A LARCENY IN THE 1600 BLK OF 24TH AVE NW ON 12/26. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVED, THE SUSPECT BECAME COMBATIVE WITH THE OFFICER AND A PHYSICAL ALTERCATION ENSUED. THE OFFICER DEPLOYED THEIR CONDUCTED ELECTRICAL DEVICE WHICH ALLOWED THE SUSPECT TO BE PLACED INTO CUSTODY. BOTH THE OFFICER AND SUSPECT WERE TREATED FOR MINOR INJURIES AT THE SCENE.
