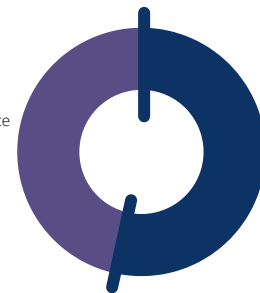

AFTER INITIATING A SILVER ALTER OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO LOCATE THE MISSING PERSON IN TEXAS WHERE THE LOCAL AGENCY WAS ABLE TO RECOVER THEM SAFELY.
