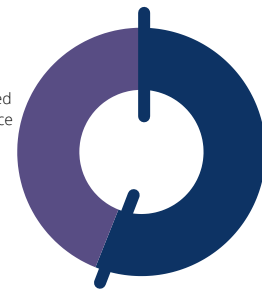

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A BURGLARY IN PROCESS FROM A LOCAL BANK ON 1/20. SECURITY REPORTED MULTIPLE SUSPECTS PRYING OPEN AN ATM AT THEIR LOCATION IN THE 3600 BLK OF W MAIN ST. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED THREE INDIVIDUALS INVOLVED IN THE BURGLARY NEARBY. ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT ASSOCIATED WITH THE BURGLARY WAS ALSO LOCATED. TWO OF THE SUBJECTS ADMITTED TO BEING INVOLVED IN THE BURGLARY. ALL 3 SUBJECTS WERE ALSO LINKED TO SIMILAR OFFENSES IN OTHER JURISDICTIONS. THE THREE WERE ARRESTED AND BOOKED INTO CCDC ON MULTIPLE CHARGES.
- NPD TEAMS WORKED AROUND THE CLOCK STARTING ON 1/23 FOR THE WINTER STORM. PATROL, DISPATCH, ANIMAL WELFARE, PIO, AND INCIDENT COMMAND TEAMS WERE ALL ACTIVE IN A COORDINATED CITY RESPONSE TO KEEP OUR COMMUNITY PREPARED AND SAFE DURING THE MULTI-DAY INCIDENT.
- PATROL TEAMS WORKED TO ASSIST WITH SAFETY PLANNING AND ONSITE SAFETY COVERAGE AT VARIOUS COMMUNITY GATHERINGS THIS WEEK. IF YOU ARE COORDINATING A COMMUNITY EVENT WITH ANTICIPATED DISRUPTIONS OR LARGE NUMBERS OF PEOPLE, WE ENCOURAGE YOU TO CONTACT NPD SO THAT WE CAN WORK TOGETHER ON KEEPING ATTENDEES AND THE COMMUNITY SAFE.
- DURING THIS WEEK, NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ADOPTED OUT 23 ANIMALS, REUNITED 6 WITH THEIR OWNERS, AND TRANSFERRED 1 ANIMAL TO A RESCUE. NAW ALSO TOOK IN 30 NEW ANIMALS DURING THIS TIME. ANIMAL WELFARE CURRENTLY HAS 122 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 29 PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
