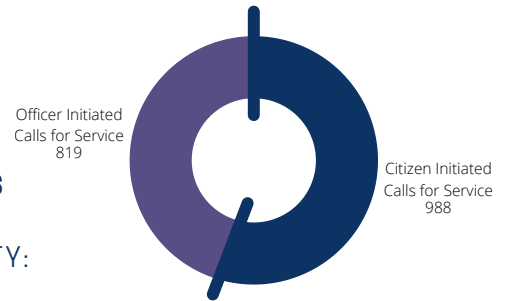

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORTED SHOOTING IN THE 4200 BLK OF FORT RD ON 2/25. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED TWO INDIVIDUALS, EACH WITH A GUNSHOT WOUND. A THIRD VICTIM WAS LOCATED AT A LOCAL HOSPITAL. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT THERE WAS A DISTURBANCE IN THE STREET BETWEEN SEVERAL INDIVIDUALS. ONE SUBJECT PULLED A GUN ON ANOTHER SUBJECT. THAT SUBJECT ALSO PULLED OUT A GUN. THEY EXCHANGED GUNFIRE AND BOTH WERE HIT AS WELL AS ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL STANDING NEARBY. ALL INJURIES SUSTAINED DURING THE INCIDENT ARE NON-LIFE THREATENING IN NATURE.
- STARTING APRIL 1, A CITY ORDINANCE MIRRORING STATE LAW, WILL MAKE SMOKING MARIJUANA BY DRIVERS OR PASSENGERS OF A VEHICLE SUBJECT TO MUNICIPAL CITATION. THE LAW ADDS SIMILAR RESTRICTIONS AS ALCOHOL AND BEER CONSUMPTION IN VEHICLES. SIMILAR TO ALCOHOL, MARIJUANA USE CAUSES IMPAIRMENT THAT CAN LEAD TO DANGEROUS DRIVING. NO MATTER THE SOURCE, IT IS NEVER SAFE TO DRIVE A VEHICLE WHEN IMPAIRED.
- STARTING APRIL 1, A CITY ORDINANCE MIRRORING STATE LAW, WILL MAKE HOLDING OR OPERATING AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE IN A SCHOOL ZONE OR CONSTRUCTION ZONE SUBJECT TO CITATION. ADDING COMMON SENSE RESTRICTIONS TO COMMON SOURCES OF DRIVER DISTRACTION IS A KEY TO PUBLIC SAFETY, ESPECIALLY IN THESE CRITICAL AREAS. SAFE DRIVING REQUIRES ATTENTION TO THE ROADWAY, AVOIDING DISTRACTIONS OF ALL TYPES WHILE DRIVING IS CRITICAL TO THE SAFETY OF ALL.
- NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ADOPTED OUT 47 ANIMALS, REUNITED 14 WITH THEIR OWNERS, AND TOOK IN 44 NEW ANIMALS THIS WEEK. THERE ARE CURRENTLY 107 ANIMALS IN THE CARE OF NAW, WITH 31 IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
