WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A LOCAL HOSPITAL FOR A REPORTED SEXUAL ASSAULT ON 3/15. THE SUSPECT, A 44-YEAR-OLD MALE LIVING IN IOWA AND A REGISTERED SEX OFFENDER, HAD BEEN COMMUNICATING WITH A JUVENILE NORMAN RESIDENT VIA SOCIAL MEDIA. THE SUSPECT ENCOURAGED THE JUVENILE TO SNEAK OUT AND THEY DROVE TO A LOCAL HOTEL WHERE THE ASSAULT OCCURRED. OFFICERS PIECED TOGETHER THE INITIAL INFORMATION AND WERE ABLE TO LOCATE AND IDENTIFY THE SUSPECT. THE SUSPECT WAS ARRESTED FOR 2ND DEGREE RAPE AND LEWD ACTS.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE AREA OF I-35 AND LINDSEY FOR A REPORT OF DOWNED POWER LINES ON 3/15. HIGH WINDS HAD CAUSED SEVERAL POWER FALL ACROSS ED NOBLE PKWY AND I-35. I-35 WAS CLOSED TO ALL TRAFFIC FOR APPROXIMATELY 12 HOURS AS CREWS WORK TO REPAIR DOWNED POWER LINES. OFFICERS ASSISTED WITH CLOSURES AND DETOUR ROUTES.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO MULTIPLE REPORTS OF SHOTS FIRED IN THE AREA OF CAMPUS CORNER ON 3/18. CALLERS PROVIDED GENERAL SUSPECT INFORMATION AND A POSSIBLE VEHICLE DESCRIPTION. OFFICERS SPOKE WITH WITNESSES, REVIEWED VIDEO, AND PROCESSED EVIDENCE AT THE SCENE. NO KNOWN VICTIMS WERE IDENTIFIED, BUT THREE BUSINESSES WERE DAMAGED. THE CASE REMAINS UNDER INVESTIGATION.
- NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ADOPTED OUT 30 ANIMALS, REUNITED 9 WITH THEIR OWNERS, AND TRANSFERRED 6 TO RESCUES. THEY ALSO TOOK IN 52 NEW ANIMALS. CURRENTLY, NAW HAS 108 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 26 IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
