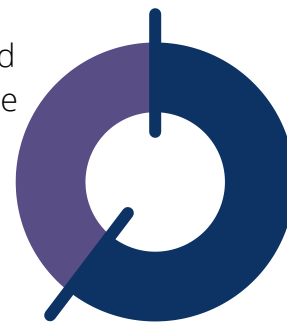

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS ASSISTED THE CLEVELAND COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE IN THE SEARCH FOR A JUVENILE WHO HAD ESCAPED FROM THE SECURE FACILITY IN THE 1600 BLOCK OF W. TECUMSEH RD ON 4/6. A FEW MINUTES AFTER THE INITIAL REPORT, COMMUNICATIONS RECEIVED ANOTHER CALL FROM THE 1300 BLK OF W. TECUMSEH RD STATING AN ATTEMPTED CARJACKING HAD OCCURRED. THE DESCRIPTION MATCHED THE ESCAPED JUVENILE. THE SUSPECT HAD ATTEMPTED TO ACCESS AT LEAST 2 DIFFERENT VEHICLES BEFORE RUNNING FROM THE AREA. A PERIMETER WAS ESTABLISHED AND A CITIZEN REPORTED SEEING THE SUBJECT NEARBY. OFFICERS USED A DRONE TO LOCATE AND TRACK THE SUBJECT. WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF CCSO DEPUTIES, OFFICERS PLACED THE SUBJECT INTO CUSTODY WITHOUT FURTHER INCIDENT. THE SUBJECT WAS TRANSPORTED TO CCDC AND ADDITIONAL CHARGES FOR ROBBERY, UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A VEHICLE, AND ASSAULT WITH A DANGEROUS WEAPON WERE SUBMITTED.
- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO A REPORT OF A STABBING IN THE 200 BLOCK OF N. FLOOD AVE ON 4/8. ONCE ON SCENE, OFFICERS LOCATED ONE ADULT MALE WITH A STAB WOUND TO HIS ABDOMEN. THE INITIAL INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT TWO INDIVIDUALS BECAME ENGAGED IN AN ALTERCATION WHEN ONE STABBED THE OTHER BEFORE WALKING AWAY FROM THE AREA. OFFICERS LATER IDENTIFIED AND LOCATED THE SUSPECT. HE WAS ARRESTED WITHOUT INCIDENT AND BOOKED INTO THE CCDC ON A COMPLAINT OF ASSAULT AND BATTERY WITH A DANGEROUS WEAPON.
- NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ADOPTED 30 ANIMALS, REUNITED 9 WITH THEIR OWNERS, AND TRANSFERRED 3 TO RESCUES. THEY ALSO TOOK IN 45 NEW ANIMALS THIS WEEK. NAW CURRENTLY HAS 113 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 38 IN PLACEMENT WITH FOSTERS.
