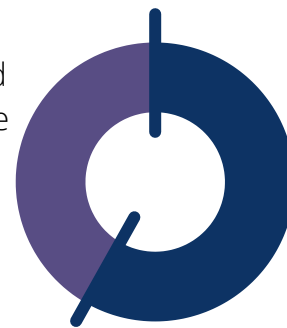

WEEK IN REVIEW

- OFFICERS RESPONDED TO AN APARTMENT COMPLEX IN THE 3000 BLK OF OAKTREE AVE ON 4/12 FOR A REPORTED CARJACKING. WHILE OFFICERS WERE ON SCENE GATHERING DETAILS, OTHER PATROL UNITS OBSERVED THE VEHICLE REPORTED AS STOLEN AND CONDUCTED A HIGH-RISK STOP NEAR 12TH AVE NE AND TECUMSEH RD. AS THE INVESTIGATION PROGRESSED, IT BECAME CLEAR THAT NO CARJACKING HAD ACTUALLY OCCURRED. INSTEAD, A FRIEND OF THE OWNER HAD TAKEN THE VEHICLE AND THE OWNER DECLINED TO PURSUE CHARGES. FURTHER INVESTIGATION OF THE INITIAL INCIDENT DETERMINED THAT 2 INDIVIDUALS HAD BEEN ASSAULTED BY 2 OTHER SUBJECTS DURING THE INITIAL INCIDENT. THE 2 VICTIMS ALSO DECLINED TO PURSUE CHARGES. THE TWO INCIDENTS AND INVESTIGATIONS RESULTED IN AN INCREASED POLICE PRESENCE AND CONCERN FROM RESIDENTS WITHIN THE COMPLEX. THERE WAS NO THREAT TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC DURING EITHER INCIDENT.
- ON 4/18 NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE HOSTED OUR “SPRING PAWS” COMMUNITY EVENT AT THE SHELTER. OVER 145 VISITORS CELEBRATED PETS, PEOPLE, AND OUR COMMUNITY. DURING THE WEEK, NORMAN ANIMAL WELFARE ADOPTED OUT 38 ANIMALS, REUNITED 8 WITH THEIR OWNERS AND TRANSFERRED 1 TO RESCUES. ANIMAL WELFARE ALSO TOOK IN 67 NEW ANIMALS DURING THIS TIME. CURRENTLY, THE SHELTER HAS 172 ANIMALS IN THEIR CARE WITH 33 OF THOSE BEING PLACED IN FOSTER HOMES.
